Orasmuch as in a well grounded Christian Common Wealth, Matters concerning Feligion and the Honour of god ought in the Sri place to be endeavourd & taken into confideration, as that which is not only most acceptable to God, but the bear way & means to ob-

tain his Mercy & Dleffing upon a cople or Country.

Be it therefore Ena tea by the Kings most Excellent M jety by & with the Advice & Confent of this present General Attembiy and the Authority of the tame, that ail things that have been heretofore legally done by vertue of former Acts of this Province for this purpose made, and bearing this little or tending thereto, in and fince the Year 1692 be and he hereby raty and & confirmed according to the reasonable intent & direction of the taid Lawt, to the intent that the further proceedings on so great and good a work may be advanced & persected by this

Law. T which purpote,

Be it Enasted by the authority aforesaid, that the Book of Common Prayer and Admini-Pration of the factarients, with other Rites and Ceremony's of the hurch, according to the ule of the hurch of E gived, the falter or falins of Davi and Morning & Evening raver therein contain'd, be folemaly read by all & every Mini er or Reader in every Church or other place of publick Worthip within this crovince. And whereas the prefent consitution of this I roviece being in its Infancy, will not admit of railing a maintenance by way of Tyth's as in Emgland, we it is no fed by the authority aforefaild, that for the incouraging of faithful & able Miniters labouring in the work of the Golpel to come and refide in this rovince, in lead of fugh Tithes ufally in England as aforefaid, a Lax or Aife Iment of forty pounds of tobacco pale he yearly and every year fuccentively levy'd upon every tax ible person within each re spective Parish within this rovince as they have been now are or hereafter shall be laid out limitted & appointed by the aw of this Province and enter'd upon Record as the faid former Laws therein did dire ', which faid a feilment of forty pounds of tobaccoper pole hall always be paid & allow'd to the Minifeers of each respective Pari h having no other benefice to offi iare in, prefented industed or appointed by his Excellency the Governour of this Province or other perion thereunto legally authorized in manner hereafter express and ordained: And every fuch Mini er is hereby required and injoy ned to app int and constantly to keep a Clark of such yari in Church and to pay and fatisfic fuch Clark the jum of one thousand pounds of cobac co yearly and every year out of the faid forty per pole.

And to prevent all illegal & unlawful Marryages not allowable by the Church of England but forbidden by the Table of Marryages, Be it Enacted by the authority aforefaid, that no isfinite Pries or Magnitrate shall presume to joyn together in marryage any persons what soe ver contrary to the Table of Marryages by this A appointed to be set up in every Parish Church within this Province; nor shall any persons forbidden to marry tog thereby such table of marryages presume to be joyned in marryage under the penaltys sollowing (that is no say) upon the penalty of sive thousand pounds of tobacco upon the Minister Pries or Magistrare joyning such persons in marryage, and under the like penalty of sive thousand pounds of tobacco upon the persons so joyned in marriage, to our Sovereign Lord the King for the uses in

this Act hereafter mentioned.

Prich can be had, and to attentian what shall be paid for marryages; see it likewise and by the authority aforesaid, that in every parish where any Mini ter or Incumbent shall reside, or have charge of Souls therein, no suitice or Magistrate shall joyn any persons in marryage under the penalty of sive thousand pounds of tobacco for such of ence, to our Sovereign, or I the King as aforestid, and that it shall be lawful for every Minister to take & receive of every person or p isons by him marryed the sum of sive shillings sterling and no more, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding. Provided such persons come to such parish Church or Chapel actime of Divine Service for contrasting such marryage.
