

To the end that no powder may be ignorant of the
Laws in this province 17

Be it Enacted by the King most
Excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent
of his Majesty's Honourable Council and Assembly of this
province and the Authority of the said that from
henceforward all the Acts that shall pass from this
and all the succeeding Assemblies shall be written
to be true and fairly transcribed on parchment and for want
thereof on good paper with a parchment cover and by writ
under the great Seal of this province from time to
time by the Keeper of the Seal for the time being
to the Clerk of each respective County shall be trans-
mitted and command to them in the said writ
shall be given the said Acts in their own and respective
County at their next County Court to be published and
proclaimed firmly to be observed and kept and lodged
with the Clerk of each respective Court for the use
thereof

And be it further Enacted by the
Authority aforesaid that every County and respective County
shall from time to time pay to the Chancellor for the
time being for such transcriptions of the said laws so much
Money as by the said Honourable Assembly in which the said
Laws are made shall be assessed and allowed
