

provincial allowance unto the Grand Jury of the said Province  
in the year and respective County Courts any sume of £100  
at the discretion of the said Justices not exceeding five bushels  
of dry peounds for each Court Day. That service to be paid out of  
the aforesaid respective County Services.

And be it further Enacted that all  
that and may be necessary for the Justice of the province  
shall be allowed unto every petit Jury. Witnessed to receive  
the sume of twenty pounds of £100 for every  
day such Juror shall attend the said service to be paid thereon.

And be it further Enacted that  
any party to any suit or action before the said Justices  
or any other Court or Court of the province shall be allowed  
one pound of £100 to be paid by the party  
having the verdict in any cause so espoused by the party  
and the same shall pass and be allowed in the  
same sume as aforesaid and shall be taken off the provincial  
rent for the time being chargeable of the person liable thereto  
as per the account of the provincial court with an account  
of the number of days they attended and the sume of  
they were retained for before the committee for laying and  
affixing the publick seal yearly before the sheriff,
