An Act Declaring the continuance
of the payment of the twelve pence per hog head from
the death of the late right Honble Charles Lord Bal-
low until the twenty ninth day of September next
Whereas by sundry laws heretofore made there
has been a Duty of Twelve pence per hog head laid on
Tobacco made payable to the late right Honble Charles
Lord Balow during his Natural life in con-
sideration of his taking Tobacco at the rate of two pence
per pound in lieu of his quit rents and fines for
alienation. And whereas his Lordship is now
Deceased by which the continuance of that Duty
on the former Law Decays. Notwithstanding
which there have been diverse Summes collected by
his late Lordship's Officers as by Virtue of that Law
before notice of the Determination thereof by his late
Lordship's Decease and for that it is thought necessary
