C H A P. XXIII. An ACT to prevent Evils arising from the entering up Judgments Ditto. upon Bonds, commonly called Judgment Bonds; to direct the Manner of issuing Executions on Loan-Office Bonds, and to regulate certain Fees therein mentioned. Lib. B.L.C. fol. 422.

HEREAS it has been the Practice to take Bonds, with Power Preamble. contained in the Condition of fuch Bonds upon Non-Payment, to any Attorneys practifing in any Court of Record within the Dominion of Great-Britain, to confess Judgment, and thereupon, without any previous Process, Judgments have not only been confessed in the Provincial and County Courts of this Province, but also out of Courts, before a single Magistrate, and Executions have issued thereon, to the great Damage of many People, who, in case Capias had issued, and they had Time to plead to such Bonds, many good Reasons might have been pleaded against the same; For prevention of which Evils for the future, it is humbly prayed that it may be Enacted;
