CHAP. XIII.

Mile above a Place called The Burnt-house Woods; and running thence up the said Road to a bounded White Oak standing on the East side thereof at the Head of a Draught of Sam's Creek; thence N. 55° E. to a Spanish Oak standing on a Ridge near William Roberts's, and opposite to the Head of a Branch called the Beaver-Dam; and running thence N. 20° E. to the Temporary Line between the Provinces of Maryland and Pennsylvania, being near the Head of a Draught of Conewago, at a rocky Hill called Rattle-Snake Hill: Which said Lines are hereby established as the Boundaries between the said Counties; and all the Lands on the South-East side of the said Lines to be deemed to be in Baltimore County, &c. and all the Lands on the West-North-West fides, to be Part of Frederick County, &c. (2.) The Branch running up to the Widow Owens, late the Wife of William Owens, and from thence up the main Branch, between John Marriot's and Edward Burris's, shall be the Division between the Two Counties of Dorchester and Worcester: And all the Lands on the North fide of the faid Branch shall be deemed to be in Dorchester County; and all the Lands to the Southward thereof to be deemed to be in Worcester County.

> C H A P. XIV.

Passed 24 June 1750. An AGT to oblige Owners, Overseers, and Managers of Iron-Works to affift in repairing Public Roads. Lib. B.L.C. fol. 497.

Owners of Iron-Works, to fend one, out of every Persons, to assist in clearing, &c. Highways.

E it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Ow-10 labouring ner or Owners, Overseer or Overseers, or Managers, of any Iron-Work or Works within this Province, shall, from Time to Time, and at all Times hereafter, permit and suffer One Labourer out of every Ten labouring Perfons, belonging to, or employed in working at fuch Work or Works, to observe the Orders of the respective Overseers of the Highways, where such Work or Works are, or may be, in affifting in or about the Clearing, Mending and Repairing the Highways or Public Roads and Bridges, in such Manner as other Labourers, and male Taxable Persons are compelled to do, by an

Act of Assembly of this Province, entitled, An Act for the marking of Highways, and making the Heads of Rivers, Creeks, Branches, and Swamps, paffable for Horse and Foot, made at a Session of Assembly begun and held at the Town and Port of Annapolis, the Fifth Day of September, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Four, and subject to the like Pains and Penalties as are by the faid recited Act directed; to be recovered and ap-

C H A P. XV.

Passed 2d June 1750.

An Act to impower the Justices of Prince-George's County Court, for the Time being, to treat and agree with an Undertaker or Undertakers, to stop a Breach now made from the North-West Branch of Patuxent River, in Jaid County, across the main Road in Queen-Anne Town in said County; and to levy on the Taxable Inhabitants thereof, a Sum of Money for the Purpojes therein mentioned. Lib. B.L.C. fol. 497.

A Supplementary Act to the Act, entitled, " An Act to impower the Justices of Queen-Anne's County Court, to fell the Materials of the old Prison of that County, and the Produce thereof to apply as therein directed. Lib. B.L.C. fol. 498. m 1749, ch. 10, Which was not carried into Execution, the Materials of the old Prison being of small Value to any Purchaser who should be obliged to pull down and remove the same; therefore the present Act impowered the Justices to sell the old Prison, together with One fourth Part of an Acre of the Public Land whereon it stood, &c.

C H A P. An AEt to enable the Vestry-men and Church-wardens of King and Queen Parish, in St. Mary's County, for the Time being, to sell a certain Tract of Land therein mentioned; and to apply the Produce Money or Tobacco arising by such Sale towards the Purchase of another Piece of Land, to be made a Glebe, for the Use of the Incumbent of that Parish, and his Successors. Lib. B.L.C. fol. 499.
