

At a Session of ASSEMBLY, begun and held at the City of *Annapolis*, the 7th Day of *December*, in the 1st Year of the Dominion of the Right Honourable *FREDERICK*, absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of *Maryland* and *Avalon*, Lord Baron of *Baltimore*, &c. and ended the 14th Day of the same Month, *Anno Domini* 1751: The following Laws were Enacted.

C H A P. XXVI.

An Act for the dividing of certain Warehouses in Talbot County, therein named. Passed 14th Dec. 1751.

C H A P. XXVII.

An ACT for the Continuation of Actions, and Securing the Peace and Good Government of this Province. *Lib. B.L.C. fol. 552.* Ditto;

WHEREAS many Writs, Precepts, Proceſs and Judicial Proceedings have been iſſued, had and executed, and ſeveral Courts of Judicature have been held in the Province, in the Name and Stile of the late Right Honourable *Charles*, Lord Proprietary, ſince his Death or Demife, and the ſeveral Judges, Juſtices, Magiſtrates, and Miniſters of Juſtice, and alſo the Officers and other Perſons within this Province, Commiſſionated by the ſaid late Proprietary, or his Lieutenant-Governor, for the Time being, not knowing that the ſaid late Proprietary had departed this Life, have, ſince the Death or Demife of the ſaid late Proprietary, under and in virtue of their ſaid reſpective Commiſſions, and the Authority of the ſame, done, acted, and performed ſuch Duties and Services, and other Matters and Things, as appertain and properly belong to their reſpective Functions, Offices and Stations: And for that it is the Intent of this General Aſſembly, that no Diſappointment or Inconvenience whatſoever, ſhould happen or ariſe to any Suitors by Diſcontinuance, or other Error or Cauſe of Exception, by Means or Occaſion of the Death or Demife of the ſaid late Lord Proprietary, or his Name and Stile being uſed, obſerved, and purſued in ſuch Writs, Precepts, Proceſs, and Judicial Proceedings, or any Censure, Damage, Loſs, or Inconvenience whatſoever, ſhould happen or ariſe to the ſaid Judges, Juſtices, Magiſtrates, and Miniſters of Juſtice, or the Officers or Perſons Commiſſionated by the ſaid late Proprietary, or his ſaid Lieutenant-Governor, for having exerciſed, done, put in practice, or performed, any Matter, Thing, Act, Service, or Duty whatſoever, properly belonging or appertaining unto their reſpective Functions, Offices, and Stations, ſince the aforeſaid Death or Demife of the ſaid late Proprietary. And whereas it is neceſſary to the Peace and Welfare of this Province, that upon any emergent Occaſion, ſome Perſon or Perſons reſiding within this Province, ſhould be ſufficiently authorized and impowered to call and ſummon the General Aſſembly of this Province, for the Providing, Eſtabliſhing, and Enacting of good and ſalutary Laws, which, by the undoubted Conſtitution of this Province, can't be Made, Ordained, Eſtabliſhed, or Enacted, but by and with the Conſent of the Freemen of this Province, by their ſeveral and reſpective Delegates and Representatives legally called together and aſſembled by the Lord Proprietary, for the Time being, or ſome other Perſon or Perſons by him for that End and Purpose properly conſtituted,
