End of this present Session of Assembly, it shall not be lawful for any Person C H A P. or Persons, to put or lay, or to permit or allow his or their Servants or Slaves, or any Servants or Slaves under his or their Direction, to carry, put, or throw Sand or Dirt, into the said River, or any of the Navigable Branches thereof, any Earth, Sand or Dirt, Sand, or Dirt, or to lay or put on the Beach or Shore of the said River below common High-Water Mark, any Earth, Sand, or Dirt, unless such Earth, Beach or Sand, or Dirt, be sirft well secured by Stone-Walls, Dove-Tailed Log Pens, or otherwise, so that no such Earth, Sand, or Dirt, may Wash into the said River or Navigable Branches thereof, to fill up the Channel, or any gable Branch way Injure the Navigation of the said River, or Navigable Branches thereof, thereof below as aforesaid: And that every Person or Persons so offending, shall, for every Mark, unless such Offence, forseit and pay the Sum of Five Pounds Current Money; to walls, exc. of such Forseiture to the Use of his Lordship the Lord Proprietary, for the into the Support of Government, the other to him, her or them that will sue for the River.

And to the End that Proprietors of Water-Lots may be encouraged to Encourage-build Wharfs, and other Conveniencies, for the better carrying on and pro-building moting of Trade in the said Town; Be it surther Enasted, by and with the Wharfs, &c. Authority, Advice and Consent aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for any Person or Persons having any Lot or Lots, or Part of any Lot or Lots, next adjoining to the Water in Charles-Town as for as to the Channel of North-East River, not exceeding in Breadth the Water Front of such Lot or Lots, or Portion, or Part of such Lot or Lots, as shall belong to the Builder of such Wharfs, or other Conveniencies, and such Builder or Builders shall have and enjoy as such and ample Right to that Part so Built on, as to any other Part or Parcel of his or their Lot or Lots.
