C H A P. XII.

An Act for Leasing out Part of the Prison Land in Dorchester County. Lib. H.S. fol. 324. Ditto.

N. B. By this Act, (1.) The Justices of Dorchester County, or the Majority of them, are empowered to Lease out, upon the best Terms they can, all the Land reserved for the Use of the County Prison, except Half an Acre; first giving Public Notice of their Intention so to do, by Notes set up in the most Public Places of the County. (2.) The said Justices to see that the Rent reserved in such Lease be annually paid, and applied to the County Charges. (3.) Before executing such Lease, the said Justices shall lay out Half an Acre of the said Land, most convenient for the Prison, which shall still be reserved for the Use thereof.
