Be it therefore Enacted, That such part thereof, and Clause in the before recited Act of Assembly, which Relates to the Vestry-men's Subscribing the Association, and no more, is hereby Repealed and Declared Void.

And it is further Enacted by the Authority, and Consent aforefuid, That all and every Person and Persons that are at this present Time Vestry- on to be taken by men in this Province, and all other Person or Persons that for the Vestry-men, dec. Time to come shall be Elected or Chosen Vestry-Men, shall take the before recited Oath of Abjuration, and that it be Administred to them according to the Forms and Methods prescribed in the aforesaid Act of Assembly for taking the Oaths therein required to be taken, after the taking of such Oath, the Person so Elected or Chosen shall be deemed and taken as one of the Vestry, and not before.

An A& for Limitation of certain Actions for avoiding Suits at Law.

Torasmuch as nothing can be more essential to the Peace and Tranquility of this Province than the Quiering the Estates of the Inhabitants thereof, and for the effecting of which, no better Measures thereof. can be taken than a Limitation of Time for the Commencing of such Actions, as in the several and respective Courts within this Province are brought, from the time of the Cause of such Actions accruing.

BE it Enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Majesty's Governour, Council and Allembly of this numerated Province, and the Authority of the same, That all Actions of Tresspass, are limited.
