

For every *Venire facias*, or Warrant to apprehend Criminals, Thirty Pounds of Tobacco.

For Appearance, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco.

For every Respit and Continuance, Twenty eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For every Order in Criminal Cases, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco.

For Copy of every Recognizance, Twenty eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For every Indictment, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco, *per Side*, as before.

For Copying every Indictment, the same.

For Filing Plea to the same, Eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For Confession to every Indictment, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco.

For Allowance of a Writ of Error, Twenty eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For every Indictment after the First Name, Twenty four Pounds of Tobacco.

For Rule for Trial, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco.

For Copy of Panel, Eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For Recording Verdict, Eight Pounds of Tobacco.

For Entering Conviction, and Signing Judgment, Fifty six Pounds of Tobacco.

For Writ of Execution thereupon, Fifty six Pounds of Tobacco.

All other Fees, not herein comprised, belonging to the Secretary's Office, to be charged as Officers do in *England*, *pro rato*, at One Penny *per Pound*.

To the Surveyor General, and his Deputies.

TO the Survey of One hundred Acres of Land, or under, One Pound of Tobacco *per Acre*.

For any Quantity above One hundred Acres, and under Two hundred Acres, for the First Hundred, as before, and Half a Pound of Tobacco for the rest *per Acre*.

If between Two hundred Acres and Five hundred Acres, then for the First two hundred Acres, as before, and a Quarter of a Pound of Tobacco for all above.

For Five hundred Acres, as before, and for all above, Ten Pounds of Tobacco *per Hundred Acres*.

For every Plat, allowing Three Plats for every Survey (that is to say) One to the Party, One to the Examiner General, and the other to be entred upon the Surveyor's Book, Ten Pounds of Tobacco for the First one hundred Acres, or under; and after the Rate of Five Pounds of Tobacco *per Cent.* for all above the First one hundred Acres.

For Journey Fees, if the same be distant from the Surveyor's House Twenty Miles, or under, Forty Pounds of Tobacco; if above Twenty, and under Forty Miles, Eighty Pounds of Tobacco; if above Forty, and under Sixty, then One hundred and twenty Pounds of Tobacco; so *pro rato*.

For every Certificate of Survey (be the Quantity more or less) Five Pounds of Tobacco.

For the Resurvey of One hundred and forty Acres of Land, or under, made with a Circumferenter Chain, and other necessary Instruments, Four hundred Pounds of Tobacco.

For Resurvey of any Quantity of Land above One hundred and forty Acres, the same Fees that are allowed upon primitive Surveys (computing the said One hundred and forty Acres as a Part of the Survey) and no more, except it be otherwise limited by the Act for Ascertaining the Bounds of Land.
