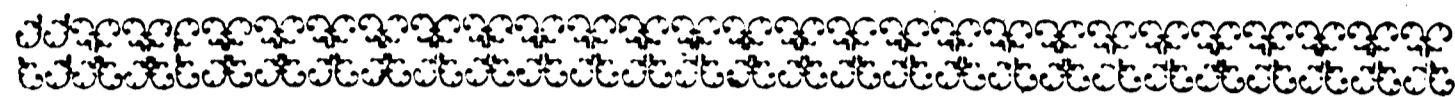


THIS Act to endure for and until Her most Sacred Majesty's Pleasure shall further be declared in Council thereon, where the Lord *Baltimore* may be heard.

An Act explaining some doubtful Expressions in the Act for Limitation of Officers Fees. No 35.

WHEREAS in the said Act for Limitation of Officers Fees it is expressed, The Secretary shall have for every Execution and Return, and a Blank left for the Sum, when it ought to have been expressed, Twenty eight Pounds of Tobacco; Be it Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Majesty's Governor, Council, and Assembly of this Province, and the Authority of the same, That he shall have

For an Execution and Return, Twenty eight Pounds of Tobacco, and
For any Matter entred upon Record (not exceeding Half a Side) Eight Pounds of Tobacco, and

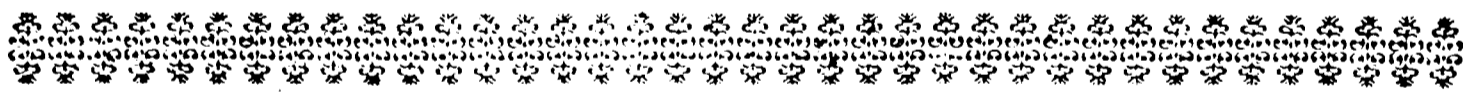
For every Continuance in Chancery, Sixteen Pounds of Tobacco.

AND be it Enacted, That such Fees in the several Cases aforesaid, as were appointed by his Excellency the Governor in Council to be paid to the Secretary until this present Session of Assembly, shall be satisfied and paid to the Secretary by the Persons from whom the same are due; and on Nonpayment thereof it shall be lawful to levy the same by way of Execution.

THIS Act to endure so long as the said Act for Limitation of Officers Fees shall be in Force, and no longer.

An Act against Forging and Counterfeiting of Foreign Coins, Gold or Silver. No 36.

FORASMUCH as divers Evil-disposed Persons have of late forged and counterfeited several Foreign Coins, commonly received amongst Her Majesty's Subjects of this Province for Current in Payment, to the great Damage of Her Majesty's said Subjects, being thereunto encouraged for that there has not heretofore been any condign Punishment by Law provided for such Offenders: Wherefore, and in order to deter such like Offenders for the future from such Evil and Pernicious Practices, Be it Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Majesty's Governor, Council, and Assembly of this Province, and the Authority of the same, That if any Person or Persons, after the Publication of this Act, falsly forge, counterfeit, or clip any such kind of Coin of Gold or Silver, as is not the proper Coin of the Kingdom of *England*, or shall aid, assist, or abet any Offender or Offenders doing the same, either by Concealing them, or by any other Ways
