of the late King James, and since His Decease pretending to be and taking upon himself the Stile and Title of King of England, by the Name of James the Third, bath not any Right or Title whatsoever to the Crown of the Realm of Great-Britain, or any other the Dominions thereunto belonging. And I do renounce, resuse and a jure any Alegiance or Obedience to him. And I do swear that I will hear Faith and true Allegiance to His Majesty King GEORGE, and Him will defend to the utmost of my Power, against all traiterous Conspiracies and Attempts what soever, which shall be made aganst his Person, Crown or Dignity. And I will do my best Endeavour to disclose and make known to His Majery, and His Successors, all Treasons and traiterous Conspiracies which I shall know to be against Him or any of them. And I do faithfully promise, to the utmest of my Power, to support, maintain and defend the Limitation and Succession of the Crown against Him the said James, and all other Persons what soever, as the same is and stands limited by an Act, entituled, An Act declaring the Rights and Liberties of the Subject, and fettling the Succession of the Crown to Her present Majesty, and the Heirs of her Body, being Protestants: And as the same by One other Act, entituled, An Act for the further Limitation of the Crown, and better fecuring the Rights and Liberties of the Subject, is, and stands limited after the Decease of Her Mijesty, and for Default of Issue of Her Majesty, to the Frincess Sophia, Electoress and Dutchess Dowager of Hannover, and the Heirs of Her Body, being Protestants. And all these Things I do plainly and sincercly acknowlege and swear, according to these express Words by me spoken, and according to the plain and common Sence and Understanding of the same Words, without any Equivocation or mental Evalion or secret Reservation whatsoever. And I do make this Recognition, Acknowledgment, Abjuration, Renunciation and Promise heartily, willingly and truly, upon the true Faith of a Christian, So help me GOD.

And that without the taking and subscribing which Oath, no Person Without shall be capable of holding, executing or enjoying any Office of Trust which to be within this Province whatfoever.

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, made the Sixteenth Day of March in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and One, entituled, An AEt for Establishment of Religious Worship in this Province, &c it was enacted, That all Vestry-men and the should subscribe the Association before they should be admitted to the Clause en-Execution of that Office. But forasmuch as by the Death of his most void. facred Majesty, King William the Third, the Subscribing the said Association is not necessary to be longer continued,

Be it therefore Enacted, That such Part thereos, and Clause in the before-recited Act of Assembly, which relates to the Vestry-men's subfcribing the Association, and no more, is hereby repealed and declared void

And it is further Enacted, by the Authority and Consent afcresaid, That all and every Person and Persons, that are at this present Time Vestry- Ab men in this Province, and all other Person or Persons that for the Time to be taken to come shall be elected or chosen Vestry-men, shall take the before- by the Vestryrecited Oath of Abjuration; and that it be administred to them accor-men, &cc. ding to the Forms and Methods prescribed in the aforesaid A& of Asfembly for taking the Oaths therein required to be taken; and after the taking of such Oath, the Person so elected or chosen, shall be deemed and taken as one of the Vestry, and not before.
