by each respective Captain of Horse, accourred as aforesaid, required as aforeskid, shall forseit and pay One Hundred Pounds of Tobacco; to be levyed as a orefaid, to the Ule of the Troop, for purchasing of Trum. to appear to pets and Colours and other Necessaries, as the Commander shall think fit; and that all such Troopers, for and in Consideration a oresaid, at all such Times as they shall be out a Ranging, shall find their own Pro-their own vilions; but when in actual Service, to be found Provilions at the Charge Provilion unof this Province, to be paid by the Publick: And if it shall happen that less in actual Service. any Trooper's Horse shall be killed in the Service, then the said Trooper to be paid for the said Hore, by the Publick, and not otherwise.

That all Persons in Holy Orders, Delegates, Magistrates and Constables, shall, in their proper Persons be exempted from being compelled exempt from to muster and train, either in Horse or Foot, during such Time as they Musters.

officiate or bear such Office as aforelaid.

Provided, That this Claule shall not extend to such Persons as already have or shall herea ter accept of Commissions for Military Service, from the Governour of this Province, for the Time being, so as to discharge such Persons from their respective Charges mentioned in such their several and respective Commissions.

And be it Enacted, by the Authority aforesaid, That all N groes and Slaves whatfoever, shall be exempted the Duty of Training, or other

Military Service.

That the Pay for the Officers and Soldiers of the Foot and Horse The Pay aforesaid, be not other than is hereafter mentioned, and for no longer to the Foot-Time than such Officers and Soldiers shall be in actual Service, viz. To every Colonel of Foot, Two Thousand Pounds or Tobacco per Month. To every Lieutenant-Coionel of Foot, Fifteen Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Major of Foot, Twelve Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Captain of Foot, One Thouland Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Lieutenant of Foor, Seven Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To an Enlign, Six Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Serjeant, Four Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Corporal, Four Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To a Drummer, Four Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. To every private Soldier, Three Hundred Pounds of Tobacco To every Major General, Chief Commander in the Field, Three Thousand Pounds of Tobacco per Month.

And that every Colonel of Hore have Two Thousand Three Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. Every Lieutenant Colonel of Horse. Horse, Fighteen Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. A Major of Horse Fisceen Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. A Captain of Horse to be allowed Thirteen Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month: A Lieuten int of Horse to be allowed One Thousand Pounds of Tobecco per Month. A Cornet, Nine Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. A Quarter-Masser, Seven Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. A Corporal, Seven Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. A Trumpeter, Seven Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. Every private Trooper, Six Hundred Pounds of Tobacco per Month. And that all thele Rates and Allowances for such Officers and Soldiers aforefaid, shall be allowed and paid, and no more; and the Months aforementioned to be accounted, computed and reckoned according to Kalendar, dar Months
