## An ACT relating to Servants and Slaves.

HEREAS there have been several Acts provided egainst Servants, Run-aways, which have hereto proved ineffectual, in regard they do not fufficiently provide Encouragement for such Person or Persons Inhabitants of this Province, as should seize such Run-aways or Servants, by this Act deemed Runaways: Therefore, for the better Discovery, Seizing and Apprehending

fuch Run-aways,

Be it Enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the No Servante Advice and Consent of His Majesty's Governour, Council and Assembly of without a this Province, and the Au bority of the same, That from and after the Note. Publication hereof, no Servant or Servants whatfoever, within this Province, whether by Indenture, or according to the Custom of the Country, or hired for Wages, shall travel by Land or by Water Ten Miles from the Houle of his, her, or their Master, Mistress or Dame, without a Note under their Hands, or under the Hand of his or their Overseer, being deemed if any be, under the Penalty of being taken for a Run-away, and to Suffer such Penalties as are hereafter provided against Run-aways.

And it is hereby further Enacted, by the Authority, Advice and Confent aforesaid, That any Servant or Servants, unlawfully absenting him, her, to serve to or themselves, from his, her, or their said Master, Mistress, Dame, or or less at Dif-Ove seer, shall make such Satisfaction by Servitude, or otherwise, at cretion. the Discretion of the Justices of the County-court, where such Runaway Servant did dwell, not exceeding Ten Days Service for any One Day's Ablence; with such reasonable Cost sor his, her, or their Taking-up, as the Court shall think fit, be it before or after the Expiration of such Servant's first Time of Servitude, by Indenture or

otherwise.

Be it surther Enacted, by the Authority, Advice or Consent aforesaid, Persons that That any Person or Persons whatsoever, that shall wittingly or willingly vants or entertain any luch Servant or Slave unlawfully absenting him, her or slaves to be themselves, as aforesaid, shall be fined Five Hundred Pounds of To-fined 5001. bacco, for every Night or Twenty-Four Hours, that such Person or for every Persons shall give such Entertainment as aforesaid; the one half to his 24 Hours. Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, for the Support of Government, and the other half to the Informer, or him or them that shall sue for the same; to be recovered in any County-court of this Province, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information, wherein no Essoyn, Protection or Wager of Law to be allowed.

And be it further Enacted, That if any free Negro or Mulatto shall harbour or entertain any such Servant or Slave, as aforesaid, in every Mulatto enfuch case he or they so offending, shall forseit and pay, as aforesaid, for tertaining as every such Offence, the Sum of One Thousand Pounds of Tobacco; the fined 1000 L one half to our Sovereign Lord the King, his Heirs and Successors, for Tobacco. the Use of the Free-Schools, the other half to the Party grieved; to be
