Be it Enasted, by the Authority, Advice and Consent aforesaid, That in case there shall not appear, or have not appeared a sufficient Number of Justices at the Time and Place appointed for the holding the Countycourt in the several Counties within this Province, to adjourn such Countycourts regularly and legally, according to the Tenor of their Commissions, and the Act of Assembly of this Province, in this case made and provided, That then and in such Case, every such County-court shall be and stand hereby adjourned from the appointed Day in August, until fuch Day in November following as such Court ought to have been adjourned to; any Law, Statute or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

An ACT for Transferring the Payment of all such Fines and Forseitures as shall hereaster arise or happen upon the Breach of any the Penal Laws of this Province, to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor.

THEREAS his most Gracious Majesty King GEORGE, has been pleased to restore the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor of this Province to the Government thereof, whereby all the Fines, Penalties and Forfeitures that shall hereafter happen, and are by the several Acts of Assembly of this Province now in Force, made payable to our Sovereign Lord the King, his Heirs or Successors, ought to be made payable to the Righ Honourable the Lord Proprietor of this Province. And whereas the said Laws have all lately been Re-enacted and Revised with great Care, and at the vast Expence of this Province, and are found to be beneficial, and much conducing to the Peace and Welfare thereof, To the End that all unnecessary Charges may be avoided, It is humbly prayed that it may be

And be it Enacted, by his Lordship the Lord Proprietor, by and with the All Penalties Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governour, and the Upper and Lower payable to his Houses of Assembly, and by the Authority of the same, That where by any Lordship, inthe Laws of this Province, any Fines, Penalties or Forfeitures are made payable to, or recoverable by the King's Majesty, or in his Name, to any the Uses in the same Laws express'd, all such Fines, Forseitures or Penal. ties shall henceforward be payable to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of this Province, his Heirs and Successors, and be recoverable by him or them, or in his or their Name to the same Uses as by those Laws are express'd; any Law, Statute, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Provided nevertheless, That it be always construed, understood and His Lord- adjudged, That where any of the faid Fines are directed by those Laws ship's, instead to be appropriated or applied towards the Support of Governty's Govern- ment, his Lordship's the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary his Government of this Province, be thereby understood and none other. ment.

And be it further Enacted, by the Authority, Advice and Consent aforesaid, That all manner of Suits, Indictments, Informations, or other Pro-In Indi&his Lordship's secutions that shall hereafter be made for any such Fines, Forseitures or instead of his Penalties as asoresaid, wherein his Majesty's Name or Title ought to have been used, as a Party in such Prosecution, it shall be lawful instead Majesty's thereof, to use the Name or Title of the Right Honourable the Lord Name and Title
