An ACT for the Publication of Marriages, and to prevent unlawful Marriages.

E it Enasted, by the Right Honourable, the Lord Proprietary, by and with the zidvice and Contint of His Lordhip's Governour, and the Upper and Lower Howes of Affembly, and by the Min- to a Church of therity of the fine, That all Perfons who defire Marriage, shall England Miniapply then selves to a Minister for the Contracting thereof, and thall cause the carion accordue Publication to be made, according to the Rubrick of the Church diag to of Emiland, of their Intent to Marry, at some Church or Chappel of Eale belonging to the Parish wherein the Woman, so intended to be wherein Married, shall be resident: And in case there be no Minister, Curate or Reader in luch Parish, an Advertisement or publick Notification of such ther how then. intended Marriage shall be let up at the Court-House Door of the County where such Marriage shall be intended, there to remain for the Space of Three Weeks, at least; of which Advertisement put up as aforefaid, the Clerk of the County-Court, where such Advertisement shall be so put up, shall make a Certificate under his Hand, and the cording to Li-Seal of the County; and that it shall and may be lawful after such Publication and Certificate thereof had, for any Minister, duly qualihy'd, to joyn to ether in Matrimony any fuch Perfons to Published, according to the Liturgy of the Church of England, faving to the Minister of the respective Parishes where such Publication shall be made, their just to the proper Dues for such Marriages. And if any Person presume to contract marriage, without fuch Publication and Certificate thereof had, as aforefaid, or wife Married, without particular Lifence from the Governour, for the Time being, do privately contract Marriage, every Man fo contracted or married shall be liable to a Fine of Five I housand Pounds of Tobacco; and every of tobacco; fuch Minister joyning in Marriage any Persons without Publication or for Marrying, Lifence, or any ways infringing this Act, shall be tiable to a Fine of the like.
