An ACT for the better Supporting the Magistrates in the Administration of Justice within this Province, and for the Disabling Thomas Machemara, Fsq; to Fractice the Law therein.

Preamble as to Mr. Macne-

THEREAS Thomas Macnemara, Esq; a Practitioner of the Law and Attorney in several of the Courts within this Province, has been fundry times suspended here, and in the Province of Pensilvania for his Mis-Deeds; and re-admitted to his Practice on his fair Promites of Amendments. And whereas by the Act of Aslembly, of this Province, Entituled, An Act for the rectifying the Ill I ractices of Attornies of this Province, and ascertaining Fees to the Attorney General, Clerk of Indielments Attornies and Practitioners of the Law in the Courts of this Province, and for levying the fine by way of Execution, the several Courts have Power given them to admit and suspend such Practitioners, Suvo Jure Corona. And whereas the siid Thomas Macnem ra, on a late Suspension from his Practice o rained Her late Majesty's Order to be restored to it again, which the said Michemara has often tuggested to be an Exemption of him from the Powers given the leveral Courts by that Law, whereby the Authority of thole Courts are not only become dubious in that Part, but the faid Munemar: has, seemingly, depended on the said Order as his Justification to treat them in an Irdecent Manner, when he pleads before them, and even to despile their Authority, and Affront their Perf n ; which they have been cautions of punishing him for, being partly deterred by the great Interest in England, whereon he has frequently Valued himself, is being far superior to theirs, and part y by the Threatning, Litigious and Revingef. I Temper, as well as his Method of Practifing upon many unminking People, to suprize them into Certific tes and Afidavits in his Favour, the better to gain his Points of thole that thwart him; by which he has at Length arrived to to Intollerable a Degree of Price and Ar o ance, that he has ever attackt the Governour hindelf in his Character and Government, for Cautioning Maurice Buchfield, 11q; his Majesty's S rveyor-Ceneral a ainit preferring the faid Michimira to the Collectorship of Paturent, as a Person of Juspected Character and Principle, the said Monemara being at first coming into this Province, an hish Papist, and tince declared himf. If to be of the Church of England, without any other Motives ever heard of by this Assembly, save those of Interest for the fale of his Practice and having Opportunity thereby or ferving a Forish Faction on all Occasions, as he has frequently done, particularly in his appearing in the Defence of tome of them, when profecuted in a 'pecial Court of Oyer and Terminer for drinking the Pretender's Health, and audacion fly Curling His facred Majesty, King GEORGE, and firing the City Guns on the supposed Pretender, on which Occasion he to warmly espouled their Caule, as even to dare that Court to proceed agairst them.

And wheras it is obvious to this present General Assembly, That the said M chemaro's Insolence has much encreased since he has the Flonour to be employed to prosecute the Suits of the Crown, by the Means of the said Maurice birchsiela, Esq; insomuch as he has affronted the Governour and Chancellor of this Province, publickly in the Execution
