An ACT to prohibit the clandestine Running of Tobacco into any of the neighbouring Colonies.

HEREAS several Persons residing and trading within this Province, regardless of the common Interest thereof, for the Sake of their own private Advantage, carry large Quantities of Tobacco into several of the neighbouring Colonies, without making any Entry thereof, paying the lawful Duties, or giving any Security to prevent its being carried into Places prohibited by Law, contrary to the manifest Intent of several Acts of Parliament, to the Prejudice of the Crown, and the Lord Proprietor, as well as the Discourage. ment of the Trade of the Province. To remedy which Evils,----- Beit Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor, by and with the Advice and Confent of His Lordship's Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That no Person whatsoever, shall presume to transport out of this Province, (by Land or Water) any Hogshead, Package or Parcel of Tobacco, without first entering the same according to Law, with the proper Officers; and that whoever shall, without making such Entry, carry or transport, or cause to be carried or transported, any Tobacco as aforesaid, shall (for every Hogshead or other Package,) forseit Ten Pounds Sterling; and for every On Penalty. Parcel weighing Five Hundred Pounds of Tobacco the like Sum, and so in Proportion for a greater or less Quantity, one Half to the Lord

Proprietary, the other Half to the Informer, or him that will fue for the same; to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information, wherein no Essoyn, Protection or Wager of Law to be allowed. And be it Enacted, That any Tobacco that shall be put on Board

of any Boat or other Vessel, in any River or Creek within this Province,
