to an lilue on the Country is to be p'eaded, the Islues shall be made up and compleated by the last Day of February next; and that all Declarations in Actions to be commerced in the Provincial Court shall be filed with the Clerk within Thirty Days after every Appearance-Court; to be comand the issue made up where the General !ssue or other General Plea pleated. terding to an issue on the Country shall be pleaded, shall be made up within Thirty Days after the fileing the Declaration: But where special Pleadings are necessary, the Court (upon Motion) may grant such Time as shall be thought reasonable: And that the Plantiff in every Cause to be tryed before the said Justices shall give the Defendant or his Attorney Norice Ten Days at least before the Beginning of the Assizes that the I'ryal is to be in, of his Intention to inlift on a Tryal; and that if after such Notice given, the Caule shall be delayed until another Assizes, the Party cauling such Delay shall pay all the Cost and Charge that shall be occasioned thereby.

And be it Enacted, That the leveral Sheriffs shall summons Forty of Sheriffs to the most capable and substantial Free-holders within their Bailiwicks, summons For-Twenty Days before the Assizes shall begin, to serve as Grand and Pe-fr Jury men. tit luiors; and that every Free-holder that shall be so summoned, and who must apshall n glect or refuse to appear, shall incur the same Penaities and Forfeitures as Jurors summoned to the Provincial Court are liable to; and that no Perlon that is not incapable or disqualified by Luw to serve as a Juror, shall have any Exemption, except Councellors, Clergymen, cepted. Assembly Men, Magistrates and Constables; and that every Grand-Jury shall have an Allowance not exceeding Four Hundred Pounds of To-lowances. bacco, and every Petit Juror Fifteen Pounds of Tobacco for every Days Attendance, besides the lawful Fees for Verdicts in civil Cases;

to be assessed in the County Levy as usual.

And be it Enacted, That the Two Justices of Assize shall be allowed by the Publick, Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco each of them, to lowance. be paid in the Counties respectively where they reside, for every Circuit, and no more; and such of the County Justices as they shall associate with them, the same as they are allowed for sitting in the County-Courts

And 'e it Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Justices to make all such Rules and Orders as may be convenient and ne- Pertons transcessary for the Furtherance of Justice and Right, and to impose reasonable growing this Fines, Forseitures and Penalties upon such as shall transgress them.

Provided always, That such Rules and Orders shall be agreeable to Provided, &c. the Laws of England and this Province. And that all Sheriffs, Bailiffs and other Officers and Persons whatsoever, shall yield due Obedience to All persons to all Process, Warrants and Precepts, that shall be issued by, or returnable beab dient to the faid Justices.

And be it Enacted, That the next Provincial-Court shall begin the Third Tuisday of May which shall be in the Year of our Lord Seventeen Provided. Hundred and Twenty Four, and not before; and that all Actions now de-Courtem vid pending in that Court of what Nature soever, shall be and are by this at Act ons de-Act continued until the Third Tu sday in May; and that all Writs, Pro-pinding therecess and Precepts already issued, or to be issued out of the Provincial Court, returnable to the next Court, shall be returnable to the said Third Tuelday of May; and that all Sheriffs, Coroners and other Officers that have arrested or shall arrest any Person or Persons by Virtue of
