

And in Case the said Master shal refuse the said Oath or upon Suspicion of having
Goods on board for which He hath not cleared It shall be lawfull for the said Master
Officer to enter on board any such Shipp or Vessel and the same to Search for any
such Goods as aforesaid anything in this Act before mentioned notwithstanding.

Maryland: At a Session of Assembly begun and held at the City of
Annapolis in the County of Anne Arundell the 17th Day of July in the
first year of the Dominion of the Right Hon: Charles a boleto -
Lord and Proprietarie of the Province of Maryland and Avalon
Lord Baron of Baltimore &c^o Anno Domⁱ One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Sixteen, His Excy John Hart Eg being Gov^r -
were Enacted the Laws following.

among which is,

(No. 7) An Act Ascertaining the Gage and Taxe of Tobacco Hoggheads -
and to prevent Cropping cutting and Defacing Tobacco taken on board
Shippes or Vessells upon the eight and for laying Impositions on Tobacco for
the Hogghead for the Support of Government and for encouraging -
Settlements in this Province by ascertaining the manner of paying -
his Lordships Alienation Taxe and Quarters for the Termes therein -
proposed and for taking of the Thre pence of a Hogghead formerly -
raised for the publick Charge.

Forasmuch as the Laws heretofore made for ascertaining the Gage of Tobacco
Hoggheads have in great Measure proved ineffectual either for want of laying -
sufficient Penalties upon the Offenders or of proper Methods to inflict them, but
more especially as it seemed to this present Generall Assembly by requiring a Compliance
with such a Gage as has been found by experience to tend to the ruin of such Traders -
as were strict Observers of it, the Generality of our Tobacco being of so light and
chaffy a nature that it has been found wholly impracticable & in a manner -
impossible to Pack or Prize so much of it in a Hogghead of the late Gage of Thirty Inches
in the Diameter of the Head as would suffice for the payment of Freight and other -
Charges arising thereon the Freight of such small Hoggheads having been frequently
brought in debt by the smallness of the quantity of Tobacco contained therein to the great
Dishage of the Tobacco Trade particularly of the poor Traders there in which seems in a -
manner to have brought the latest of the aforesaid Law into a generall disuse
it being rather more mischievous to the Traders to be brought in debt by their
strict observance of that Gage than to loose their Tobacco due for exceeding it
for remedy where of for the future BE IT ENACTED by the Right Honourable the
Lord Proprietary by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordships Governor
and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly and the Authority of the same -
That from and after the End of this present Session it shall and may be lawfull
for any person or Persons whatsoever suspecting discovering or knowing of any
Hogghead or Hoggheads of Tobacco that shall exceed Forty eight Inches in the -
Length of the Stake or Thirty two Inches in the Diameter of the Head within
the Groze or that shall exceed Thirty Seven Inches in the Diameter in the Bulge on any accident
or pretence whatsoever (Thirty six Inches Diameter in the Bulge being supposed
a competent Gage) to call to his assistance any Justice of the Peace & other
