HARLES by the Grace of God, King of England, Colle Scotland, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting. Whereas our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Subject; Cecilius Calvert, Baron of * * Baltemore, in our Kingdom of Ireland, Son and Heir of Sir George Calvert, Knight, late Baron of Baltemore in the same Kingdom of Ireland, pursuing his Father's Intentions, being excited with a laudable and pious Zeal for the Propagation of the Christian Faith, and the Enlargement of our Empire and Dominion, hath humbly befought leave of Us, by his Industry and Charge, to transport an ample Colony of the English. Nation unto a certain Country hereafter described, in the parts of America, not yet Cultivated and Planted, tho' in some parts thereof Inhabited by certain barbarous People, having no Knowledge of Almighty God, and hath humbly befought Our Royal Majesty to Give, Grant, and Confirm All the said Country, with certain Priviledges and Jurisdictions, requisite for the good Government, and State of bis Colony, and Country aforesaid, to him and his Heirs for ever.

KNOW YE therefore, That We, favouring the Pious and Noble Purpole of the said Barons of Baltemore, of Our special Grace, certain Knowledge, and meer Motion, Have Given, Granted and Consirmed, and by this Our present Charter, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, do Give, Grant and Consirm unto the said Cecilius, now Baron of Baltemore, his Heirs and Assigns, All that part of a Peninsula, lying in the parts of America, between the Ocean on the East, and the Bay of Chefeapeak on the West, and divided from the other part thereof, by a Right Line draws from the Promontory or Cape of Land, called,
