

*ACT impowering the Justices of the County Courts, to regulate the Bounds of Parishes, and for ascertaining the Time and Manner when and how the Forty Pounds Tobacco per Poll, shall become due and payable to the Minister and Incumbent of each Parish.*

*Passed October 28th, 1713.*

**I**T shall and may be lawful for the Justices of the several County Courts, or the major part of them, where the Bounds of any Parish or Parishes within their respective Counties, are uncertain or ambiguously expressed, to ascertain and regulate them for the Future, and having so done, to cause their Proceedings therein, to be entered in the Records of their County Courts.

WHERE Parishes are so divided, that they are partly contained in two Counties, the Justices of that County Court, wherein the disputable Parts of such Parish is contained, or the major Part of them, shall determine the same; and cause their Determination to be entered in the Records of their County Court, as above.

EVERY Minister admitted and inducted into any Parish, shall have no demand on the Vestry for the whole of the *Forty Pounds Tobacco per Poll*, for the Year he is admitted or inducted, but only such proportionable part of the same, as shall be found to be his Due, computing the Time from the Day of his Induction, to the Time of laying the next Levy for the County, in which the Parish lies.

IF the Minister die or shall be removed out of his Parish, the Vestry of that Parish shall pay to such Minister, if a live, or to his Executors or Administrators if he be dead, such proportionable part only of the *Forty Pounds Tobacco per Poll*, as shall be due to him for such part of the Year, as he continued in the said Parish, computing the same from the Time of the laying the last Levy, until the Time of such his Death or Removal. And if any Minister shall die or remove again after Induction, before any levy be laid in that County, then the Vestry shall pay to such Minister, if he be alive, or to his Executors or Administrators if he be dead, so much of the *Forty Pounds Tobacco per Poll*, as shall be due to him, computing the same from the Time of his Admission or Induction, to the Time of his Death or Removal, and no more.

*ACT to declare how the Forty Pounds of Tobacco per Poll, in such Parishes where there is no Incumbent, shall be disposed of.*

**W**HAT Tobacco of the *Forty Pounds per Poll* is or shall become due in any Parish, where there is no Incumbent; the Vestry of said Parish are impowered to dispose of, for, and towards the Repairing
