

Warrant to his Constable, to bring such Person before him, and is empowered to determine therein, by acquitting and discharging if he see Cause, or fining as by the Road Act directed, if he finds the Person culpable; the Fine to be applied to the Uses and levied in the Manner directed by the said original Act.

OF which Fines, the Justice is to keep and return a fair List to the County Court, before laying on the publick Levies; of which List, the County Court shall cause their Clerk to give a fair Copy to the Sheriff, for his collecting the same; and if refused, the Sheriff is empowered to levy the same by way of Execution, in the same Manner as the Publick and County Levies have been levied and collected, and render an Account thereof to the Justices, to be applied as above.

**ACT to oblige Owners, Overseers and  
Managers of Iron Works, to assist in  
repairing publick Works.**

*Passed May 8th, 1750.* }

**E**VERY Owner or Owners, Overseer or Overseers, or Manager or Managers of any Iron Work or Iron Works, shall be obliged to suffer and permit one Labourer out of every Ten labouring Persons, belonging to, or employed about the Works, to observe the Orders of the respective Overseers of the High Ways, where such Work or Works are or may be, in assisting in and about the clearing, mending and repairing the High Ways, Publick Roads and Bridges, in the same Way as other Labourers and Taxables are obliged to do, and under the like Penalties, to be applied and collected as directed in the above Acts for clearing High Ways &c.

*Passed October 2d, 1753.* } **ACT for repairing the publick Roads.**

**W**HERE any Person or Persons have built or shall build a Mill or Mills on any Branch or Run, where any publick or main Roads crossed or shall cross, and have erected or shall erect any Dam for such Mill or Mills, they shall be obliged to make the Top of the said Dam Twelve foot wide at least, with sufficient Bridges over the Waste or Race, and keep the same in good Repair.

WHERE any Mill erected obstructs the publick Road, and that the publick Road passes below the Dam of said Mill, the Owner or Possessor, shall be obliged to raise and make a good and sufficient Causeway across the Branch, on which the said Mill is built, twelve foot wide, and make a good and sufficient Bridge over the Tail of the said Mill, which if they refuse to do, and are thereof lawfully convicted, they shall forfeit and pay the Sum of *Twenty Pounds* current Money, one half to be applied towards defraying the County Charge, the other half to go to him or them, who shall inform or sue for the same.
