Such Owners and Possessfors shall not be obliged to send their Taxables to work on the publick Roads, except on such Mill Dam, Causeway, Race and Walte aforesaid.

THIS Act is declared to continue for Five Years, and unto the End of the next Sellion of Assembly, which shall happen, after Expiration

of the faid Five Years.

Passed February? Supplement to the above ACT.

HERE any Person or Persons have built or shall hereafter build or erect any Mill on any Branch, below the Places where publick or main Roads did or shall cross such Branch or Run, whereby the publick Road shall be any ways hurt or injured, or the Passage any way obstructed or rendered incommodious, they shall be obliged to make good and sufficient Causeways and Bridges, twelve foot wide at least, over the saidBranches, where the main or publickRoad crosses, and keep the same in good repair, under the Penalty of Inventy Pounds current Money, and the like Sum for every two Months neglect in doing so thereafter, one half of said Fine is to be applied towards the defray. ing the Charge of the County, the other half to the Informer or Person who will sue sor the same, they being also on that Account exempted from affifting at clearing the publick Roads as above

This Act continues in Force during the Continuance of the above principal Act and no longer; and by Act past December 1758, both Acts are of new continued and revived for and during the Space of

Three Years &c.

An ACT for laying an Imposition on se-Passed September & veral Commodities, exported out of the Province the Province.

LL Persons, not being Inhabitants of the Province, exporting out of the same any Beef, Pork or Bacon, shall pay unto the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, his Heirs and Successors, to be applied for the Maintenance of a Free School or Schools in the Province, the feveral Imposts following, viz. For dried Beef or Bacon, Twelve Pence the Hundred Weight, and in Proportion for a larger or lesser Quantity; Pork and Beef undried shall be exported in cask, containing Two Hundred Pounds Weight, and there shall be paid of Impost for each Barrel Twelve Pence, all the said Impost, being ordered to be collected by the naval Officers, who are impowered to fearch any Ship or Vessel, for those Commodities.
