dissenting from the Church of England, from the Penalties of certain Laws, together with the said Act last mentioned, and every Article, Clause, Matter and Thing in the said Acts contained, shall be and are in full Force, to all Intents, within the Province.

Fassed April ? ACT against forging and counterseit-15th, 1707. 5 ing Foreign Coins of Gold or Silver.

I F any Person or Persons whatever, shall fally forge or counterseit any kind of Coin of Gold or Silver, not the proper Coin of the Kingdom of Britain, or shall assist or abett any Offender doing the same, by concealing or otherwise countenancing him, every such Offender, his Aiders, Abettors and Countenancers therein, shall for the first Offence, be whipped, pillored and cropped in both Ears; and tor the Second Offence, be branded on the Cheek and banished the Province, they being duly convicted of said Crime, in any of the Courts of Record within the Province.

ACT suspending the Prosecution of the Priests of the Romish Communion, incurring the Penalties of the Act to prevent the Growth of Popery, by exercising their Function in a private Family, of the Roman Communion, but in no other Case.

O Popish Bishop, Priest or Jesuit, shall by Virtue of the Act to prevent the Growth of Popery, for or by Reason of their exercising their Functions in a private Family of the Roman Communion, be prosecuted or indicted before any of the Justices, impowered to hold Plea thereof, within the Province, for and until His Majesty's Royal Will and Pleasure shall be first signified thereof, any Law, Statute or Usage to the Contrary notwithstanding.
