APPEALS from the Court of Chancery, to the Court of Appeals, shall be subject to the same Regulations and Limitation, as the Apreals from inferior and other Courts are.

ACT for releiving the Inhabitants of the Passed June? the Province, from some Aggrievances in the Prosecution of Law Suits. 22d, 1713. S

LL Persons whatsoever residing, negociating or trading to or within the Province, having any personal Claim or Demand against any Inhabitant, wherein the original Debt or Damages do not exceed the Value of Twenty Pounds Sterling, or Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, shall by Virtue of this Act, be obliged to sue and implead their several and respective Debtors, in their several and respective County Courts, where such their Debtors inhabit or reside and not elsewhere, on Penalty of suffering a Nonsuit, and paying the Defendant his reasonable Charges, to be adjudged by the Justices, where sued.

THE Penalty in any Bond, tho' exceeding the faid Sum, shall not intitle the Plaintiff to bring his Suit to any other Court, unless the real Sum in the Condition of fuch Bond, actually exceed Twenty Pounds

Sterling or Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco.

PROVIDED, that nothing in this Act contained, shall hinder any Perfon from bringing his Action in the Provincial or Superior Courts, on any Covenant, or any Bond for the Performance of Covenants, or for the Performance or Sufferance of any Act or Acts, Thing or Things what. joever, altho' the real Damages or Sum recovered be less than Twenty Found Sterling or Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, so as the Penalty contained in such Bonds exceeds that Sum; but no Bond for Payment or Performance of any Bill of Exchange, shall be prosecuted in any Court, but the County Court, unless the original or principal Sum mentioned in such Bill of Exchange, and due on the same protested, iball amount to Twenty Pounds Sterling, or Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco.

EVERY Person or Persons Inhabitants of the Province, shall and may sue and implead in any County Court, where the Debtors reside, on any Bill, Bond or other Specialty, the penal or principal Sum whereof exceeds One Hundred Pounds Sterling, or Thirty I housand Pounds of Tobacco, (tho' the Justices Power of Judging is limited to that Sum,) if the Ballance really due, does not exceed Twenty Pounds Sterling or Five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco; but the Ballance must exceed Two Hundred Pounds of Tobacco or Sixteen Shillings and Eight I'ence Sterling; and the Justices are impowered to give Judgment for the just Ballance, with Cotts of Suit.

THO' there be two or three Indorfers of any Bill fued, one Fee can only be charged by the Attorney for the same, and only one Fee for defending the Astion; and it shall and may be lawful for the Plaintiff, in any Action brought on any protested Bill, to put into any one Writ
