No Sheriff shall summon as a Petit Juror, in any Court, where he knows he has any matter of fact depending for trial at the same Court he is summoned to serve in; and he is, on that Account, disqualified to serve that Court.

THE Justices of the Provincial Court shall and may allow every Perfon summoned as an Evidence before them, Forty Pounds of Tobacco for each Day they attend, besides itenerant Charges as usual, to be allowed by the Court and paid by the Party summoning them, and to be charged in the Bill of Costs; and in all cases criminal to be paid according to the Directions of the Act of Assembly for speedy Trial of Criminals and for the Payment of their Fees.

EVERY Evidence summoned before any County Court, shall be allowed Thirty Pounds of Tobacco each Day of Attendance, to be paid in the same Manner as Evidences attending the Provincial Court are before directed to be paid.

N. B. By the Assize Act past in 1752, all Clauses in the above Act relative to the Summoning Grand and Petit Jurors to the Provincial Court, were repealed. But as that Act is now expired, they again revive and are in full Force.

Passed May Supplementary ACT to the above Act.

Twelve Shillings in Money, shall be allowed and paid to every Jury, for hearing and giving their Verdict in any Cause they are sworn to give their Verdict in, whether in the Provincial or County Courts, and no more: And in case any Suitor give more than by this Act directed, and be thereof convict, such Suitor shall for such Offence (if in the Provincial Court) forfeit the Sum of Six Thousand Pounds of Tobacco or under, at the Discretion of the Court, and (if in the County Courts) the Sum of Two Thousand Pounds of Tobacco or under at the Discretion of the Court, one half thereof to the Use of Shools, the other half to the Informer or Suer for the same, if on Indictments or Actions Criminal, otherwise to the Party grieved.

Every Petit Juror summoned to any County Court, shall be all-lowed for every Day he attends, the Sum of Fifteen Pounds of Tobacco, (over and above the One Hundred and Twenty Pounds of Tobacco, or Twelve Shillings to each Jury, for each Cause,) and no more; to be paid out of the publick Levy in the County where he serves.
