

ACT declaring Probates of Deeds or other
 Matters, and Acknowledgments of
 Deeds, taken before two Magistrates
 of *Annapolis*, to be good and valid.

Passed October }
 6th, 1725. }

ALL Probates of any Deeds or other Matters made in the Mayor's Court or before two of the Magistrates of the City of *Annapolis*, and all Deeds of Lands lying within the Precincts of the City of *Annapolis*, acknowledged either by the Mayor's Court or before two such Magistrates as aforesaid, shall be and by this Act they are declared, as good and available in Law, in all Respects, as if made and acknowledged in the same Manner before one Justice of the Provincial Court, or two Justices of the County Court.

An ACT prohibiting all Masters of Ships
 or Vessels, or any other Person, from
 transporting or conveying away any
 Person, out of the Province, without
 Passes.

EVERY Person or Persons intending to depart out of the Province, shall first give Notice of their intended Departure, by setting up their Names at the Secretary's Office and at the County Court House Door, where they reside, the full Space of Three Months before; and if in said time no Person shall underwrite them, it shall be then lawful for the Governor, Keeper of the Great Seal or Secretary of the Province, for the Time being, upon Certificate thereof from the Clerk of the Provincial Court and from the Clerk of such County, where set up, to sign a Pass to such Person or Persons; for which the Party shall pay *Two Shillings and Six Pence* to the Secretary, for signing the same, and to the Clerks of the Provincial and County Courts, *Twelve Pence* each.

If any Person upon any sudden Emergency is obliged to depart, not having set up Notes as above, then he must give good and sufficient Security to the Governor, Keeper of the Great Seal or Secretary, to discharge and pay all Debts, Dues and Demands whatsoever due, owing or demandable from him, by any of the Inhabitants; and then he may have a Pass, containing the Security given, for which he shall pay as above.

ANY Masters of Ships or Vessels or other Persons whatsoever, who shall transport or convey out of the Province by Land or Water, any Person indebted to any Inhabitant, without such a Pass; shall be liable to satisfy all such his Debts, unless such Master or other Person procure his returning again in one Month after, whereby he may be liable to Justice; and every such Person as shall transport or convey out
