Passed in May Clerks within the Province, to remove some of the County Records and Papers from the publick Offices.

I T shall and may be lawful to and for the several and respective County Clerks within the Province, to take, remove or carry out of their respective publick Offices, the last Recording Book for Judgments by them kept, together with the four last Courts Docquets and Papers, next preceding the Time of such taking out, and the same to keep at their own Houses or any other Places more suitable to their Conveniency, within the County, during such Time as to them or any of them shall seem necessary, without being liable to any Penalty on that Account.

The several and respective County Clerks shall be, and are by this Ast, obliged to attend at their several and respective Court Houses one or more days in every Week, to be appointed and published by the several County Courts, and there to remain by themselves or Deputy, from Nine of the Clock in the Forenoon, till Sunset, and then and there give all possible Dispatch to the necessary Basiness of such Person or Persons as shall apply to them for the same; and that under the Pain of sorfeiting Six Hundred Pounds of Tobacco, one half to the Use of the County School, the other half to him or them who will sue for the same; to be recovered before a single Magistrate.

Nothing in this Act shall extend or be construed to extend to prevent any Clerk from being chargeable for any Misseaseance or Neglect in his Office.

This Act continues for Three Years, &c. and is from time to time continued, till September 28th, 1757, when it's of new continued for the like Space of time.
