

pear by the Register of the said Vessel to be Owners of her, are to the best of his or her Knowledge sole Owners of the same, and that he or she verily believes, that no Person whatsoever, that is not an actual Resident within the Province hath any Share or Part of the said Vessel; and shall produce Certificates of having taken such Oaths, under the Hands and Seals of the Magistrates before whom the same shall be taken, unto the Naval Officer of the Port where such Vessel shall be entered. some time before the clearing of the Vessel, the Owners of said Vessel and all others concerned shall be entitled to the same Privileges and Advantages, as if the Owners of the said Vessel had made the Oath required by the aforementioned Act, before the Naval Officer of the Port where such Entry is or shall be made.

ACT to oblige the several Officers within the Province, to write their Fees in Words at full length, and for Clerks to deliver Bills of Cost, if required.

Passed August 19th, 1731. }

ALL the several and respective Officers within the Province shall be and are by Virtue of this Act, to draw out the Particulars of their Fees, in a fair legible Hand, and in Words at full length; and on failure thereof, such Officer shall lose such Fees expressed in Words cut off or abbreviated.

THE several Clerks of the several Courts of Record, Register of the Court of Chancery, and Register of the Commissary Court, shall and are hereby obliged to deliver to the Defendant, if required, full Copies, in a fair legible Hand, of all the Costs of Suit recovered against any Defendant; and any Clerk or Register refusing so to do, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of *Two Thousand Pounds* of Tobacco, to be recovered in the County where such Clerk or Register resides; and to be applied one half to the Use of the publick County School, and the other half to the Informer suing for the same.

ACT to make and emit Thirty Six Thousand Pounds current Money of *Maryland*, in Bills of Credit, and for easing the Inhabitants of the Province and to raise a Fund for sinking the said Bills of Credit.
