Pounds in Bills of Credit, for transporting the Troops to be raised, and ordered to be replaced and repaid by applying the Duties arising on Liquors, and Fifty Shillings on every Ordinary in the Province, and First Founds for every Ordinary in Annapolis, for that Purpose.

AFTER the said Sum should be repaid, the said Duties are ordered to be applied as formerly provided.

Passed June ? 17th, 1746.

Commissioners or Trustees Office for emitting Bills of Credit, the Sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred Pounas current Money for enlisting Soldiers for the Canada Expedition, and conveying them to the Place of Rendezvous, and also for replacing the said Sum, and for the better regulating Ordinaries and Ordinary-Keepers.

By this Act Four Thousand Five Hundred Pounds Currency was taken out of the Trustees Office, towards the above Purposes, and for replacing and repaying the said Sum, it is enacted.

THAT from and after the End of that Session of Assembly, the Justices of every County, in Court fitting, are impowered and authorized from time to time and as often as need shall require, to grant Licences to such Person or Persons as they shall think fit, being Persons of good Repute, to be Ordinary-Keepers and Inn-Holders, for keeping Ordinaries and Houses of Entertainment, in such and so many Places within their several and respective Counties, for the Ease and Conveniency of the Inhabitants, Travellers and Strangers, as to them respectively shall seem meet; for which Licences, the said Persons that shall be so licenced to keep Ordinary as aforesaid, shall at the Time of his, her or their taking such Licence, pay the several Sums following; that is to say, for every Licence to keep Ordinary in the City of Annapolis, the Sum of Five Pounds current Money, and for every Licence to keep Ordinary at any other Place within the Province, the Sum of Fifty Shillings current Money, for every Year such Person shall keep Ordinary as aforesaid.

THAT during the Continuance of this Act, all Ordinary Licences shall commence and be received at every August Court, on pain, that any Person or Persons omitting or neglecting to renew their Licence
