For which Licence and Seal, such Pedlar, Hawker or Petty Chapman shall pay the Sum of Four Pounds current Money to such County Clerk, as also for a Fee the Sum of Five Shillings Money aforesaid: And all such Hawkers, Pedlars and Petty-Chapman shall and they are by this Act obliged, before they shall trade or barter as aforesaid, to renew such Licence yearly, and pay for the same as above, with the same Clerk from whom they took such first Licence, or with some other County Clerk.

THEY shall also be obliged to take the several Oaths of Allegiance, Abhorrency and Abjuration, sign the same, and repeat and subscribe the Test, before such County Clerk, from whom they shall obtain Licence, which County Clerk is by this Act impowered and directed to tender and administer the same.

In Case any Hawker, Pedlar or Petty Chapman shall be found travelling with Goods for Sale, within the Province, without a Licence for that Purpose, such Pedlar, Hawker or Petty Chapman shall forseit and pay the Sum of Eight Pounds current Money, one Moiety thereof to be paid the Sheriff and applied for his Majesty's Service, to the Uses in this Act mentioned, and the other Moiety to the Informer.

ANY Person, but more particularly every High Sheriff and his Deputies, Constable, Vestry Man and Church Wardens within the Province, shall and may, and they and every of them, are hereby directed and impowered to examine such Pedlar, Hawker or Petty Chapman, and require him or her to produce his or her Licence; and in case of resusal or neglect to produce the same, to carry them before any Justice of the Peace, and such Justice is by this Act impowered and directed to bind over such Pedlar, Hawker or Petty Chapman, to the next County Court, there to be dealt with according to Law.

In is provided, that Persons travelling with Linnen, the Growth and Manusacture of the Province, and selling or bartering the same, or any kind of Provision, or Hemp, Flax, Thread or Yarn, only of the Growth or Manusacture of this or any other place, shall not be deem'd or held as Hawkers, Pedlars or Petty Chapman, within this Act, any thing herein to the Contrary notwithstanding.

THAT for all Coaches, Chairs, Chaises and Chariots or such like Carriages belonging to or used by the Inhabitants of the Province, there shall be paid by the respective Owners thereof, the Sum of Five Shillings current Money for every Wheel belonging to them; and the Constables within the respective Hundreds shall yearly, at the taking the Taxables, take an exact Account of the Number of Wheels belonging to all such Coaches, Chairs, Chaises, Chariots and such like Carriages in their respective Hundreds, and return Lists of the same at every August Court; and two Lists thereof shall be made out by the respective Clerks ex Ossico, at every November Court, at the lay-

ing
