cannot be fold by the Importers, and that the Importer shall desire to export such Slaves or Servants, and shall give Bond with sufficient Surety to the Naval Officer, to whom such Duty hath been paid, that he shall and will export such Slaves or Servants to any other his Majesty's Plantations, it shall be lawful for the Naval Officer to repay the same Duty he received for such Servants or Slaves, in Proportion to the Number so bonded to be exported. And that a Certificate under the Hand and Seal of the Collector or Naval Officer of the District, in any other his Majesty's Colonies, where the said Servants or Slaves shall be carried to, that such Servants and Slaves have been Bona side entered with such Collector and Naval Officer, returned to the Naval Officer taking such Bond, in the Space of Six Months after the Date of the Bond, shall vacate the same.

Monies by them received from time to time, during the Coutinuance of this Act, for Licences to Hawkers, Pedlars and Petty Chapman, to the Commissioners of the Loan Office, deducting Two and a half per Centum, and so in Proportion for a greater or lesser Sum; and the Bonds of such County Clerks for discharge of their Offices, with themselves and their Sureties respectively in such Bonds, shall stand and be liable for all Monies which they shall receive by Virtue of this Act, and shall and may be sued for the Non-payment thereof, as for any other neglect or breaches in their respective Offices.

EVERY Ordinary Keeper within the Province, shall yearly on taking out Licence, pay to the Sheriff the Sum of Twenty Shillings current Money, over and above the Money already directed to be paid by the Act for taking Four Thousand Five Hundred Pounds out of the Loan Office, for the Canada Expedition.

AND all the Clauses in said Act relating to the regulating Ordinaries. Ordinary-Keepers, Ordinary Licences, and the several Clauses, Matters and Things therein mentioned, are declared to continue in sull Force, not only till said Sum is replaced, as contained in the said Act, but also till the Sum of Nine Hundred Pounds current Money, and Two Hundred Pounds Sterling taken out of the Loan Office for purchasing Provisions for the Forces raised in the Province, and the Sum of Six Thousand Pounds Currency by this Act taken out of the Land Office, and the Treasurers of the Western and Eastern Shore as above are all replaced, and till the End of the next Session of Assembly thereafter.

THE Commissioners of the Loan Office are required to keep exact Accounts, and when the above Sums are repaid and replaced, the Surplus is by Direction of the Assembly to be applied towards paying the publick Expences of this Province.

THIS Act is declared to continue till the above Sum of Six Thousand Pounds is repaid and replaced, and to the End of the next Session of As-

sembly thereafter.
