

Of an Assault, in Order to procure a Judge's Order for holding to Bail.

A. B. came before me, &c. and made Oath, &c. that on *Friday* the———Day of———last past, he this Deponent going to view his Cattle, in his own Field, *E. F.* did then in the said Field, without any reasonable Cause, in a violent Manner, assault, beat and throw this Deponent on the Ground, the Deponent making no Opposition, but the Deponent being rescued by some Persons present, from the said *E.* the said *E.* did again, so soon as he got loose, from the Persons who rescued the Deponent, a second time assault, throw down, beat and kick the Deponent about the Head and Body, so that the Blood gushed out of the Deponent's Mouth and Nose; and this Deponent further saith, that the said *E.* hath often declared, that he would kill this Deponent.

That the Defendant is Sick, and not able to Answer.

That on———last, he saw *C. D.* the Defendant in this Cause, at his House at———, and that then, he was so very Sick, and Weak in Bed, &c. that he was not capable of answering the Complainant's Bill of Complaint in this Suit; as he this Deponent apprehended.

That the said *C. D.* now has, or lately had in his Possession, (as he the said Deponent is informed, and verily believes,) divers Goods and Chattles, (or the Things may be particularly named thus, a Gold Watch of the Value of———, and upwards,) which said Chattles, &c. are the Property of him the said Deponent, and Which the said *C. D.* unjustly detains, or has unlawfully converted to his own Use. In a Drovers and Conversion.

A. B. (being one of the People called Quakers) solemnly Affirms, That &c. (as above) is indebted to the said Affirmant, &c. according to the Cause of Action, saying Affirmant instead of Deponent. A Quaker's Affirmation.
