A P P E N D I X.

*Of some material Laws, omitted to be inserted
in the forgoing Collection.*

BY a Clause in an Act past in May 1756, for continuance of
Baltimore County Court, &c. the following Supplementary
Clause to the Act for ascertaining the Time of holding County
Courts, is inserted, which Law is perpetual, and should have
been inserted Page 85 immediately after the above Act.

IT is Ordained, that it shall and may be lawful for every two Jus-
tices of the County Courts, One of them to be of the Quorum,
in Case of necessity, to prevent the Discontinuance of their respective
Courts, and for no other End or Purpose whatsoever, to call such
County Courts on the Day to which the same shall be adjourned.
AND also for the like necessity, and for the same Reason and no
other, to adjourn any County Court to any futer Time subsequent
to the Day by the above mentioned Original Act, appointed for the
meeting of the Courts in Course. Provided always, that no Business
or Proceedings whatsoever relative to such County Courts, other
than the calling and adjourning as aforesaid, shall be had, done, or
transacted in or by any Courts as aforesaid, any two Magistrates called,
unless after the meeting of such Court such Number of Magistrates
as are usually impowered cannot possibly be had.

In the Squirel Law passed *October 3d. 1728*,
which, as to the following Clause, is perpetual,
it is enacted.

THAT every Person that shall during the Continuance of this
Act, presume upon any pretence whatsoever, to come to
hang
