36th. That every committee have leave to report by bill or otherwise.

37th. That the Speaker may not enter into debate, but may vote on every question except on an appeal from the chair on a question of order.

38th. That the name of every member making any motion, presenting any petition, or proposing any member making any membe

solution, shall be inserted on the journal of the House.

39th. A motion to reconsider or stilke out for the purpose of inserting or amending, together with the amendment or matter proposed to be inserted, shall be received and the question taken on it as one a tire motion, but any member may have the same divided agreeably to the thirteenth rule of this house. 40th.
