## WEDNESDAY, January 22, 1817.

The house met. Present the same members as on yeste day. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. T. H. Dorsey delivers petitions from sundry inhabitants of Anne Arundel county, praying that a law may pass to change the place of holding the election in election district No. 2 ; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. T. H. Dorsey, Sellman and R. Dorsey.

Mr. Causin delivers a bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Specie Bank of Leonard-Town ; which was read.

Mr. F. M. Hall delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Philomathean Society of Upper Marlborough, in Prince-George's county ; which was read.

Mr. R. Dorsey delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise Thomas Bicknell to sell the real estate of Amos Gambrell, deceased, of Anne-Arundel county ; which was read.

Mr. W. Stewart delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the connecting of Water-street with King George-street, at Jones's Falls in the city of Baltimore ; which was read.

Mr. Thomas delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall in Elkton Cecil county ; which was read.

Mr. Cresap delivers a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act respecting the settlers on the reserved lands westward of Fort Cumberland ; which was read.

Mr. Frey delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the contemplated bridge over the river Susquehanna at Conowingo creek to the Pennsylvania line ; which was read.

Mr. Kell delivers a petition from John Ricaud, of the city of Baltimore, praying a special act of insolvency ; which was read and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. A. D. Mitchell delivers a petition from Richard Updegrave, praying for a law to shut up the old post road running from Grey's Hill to the Delaware line, and lying to the north of the turnpike road leading from Elkton to Christiana ; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. D. Mitchell, Frey and Beard.

Mr. Ringgold delivers a petition from the widow and heirs of Samuel Comegys, praying for the sale of a house and lot in Chester-town whereof the said Samuel Comegys died seized. Also a petition from Pegrine Banthom, of the said county, a revolutionary soldier, praying relief ; which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Ringgold, Whittington and Boyer.

Mr. A. D. Mitchell delivers a bill, entitled, An act to shut up an old road in Cecil county ; which was read.

Mr. Warner delivers a petition from William Randle, of Baltimore county, counter to the petition of Parkin and James Hammond praying for a special act of insolvency ; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

Mr. Ridgely delivers a petition from Henry M-Kinly, John M-Donald, and others, securities of Thomas Colard, late sheriff of Allegany county, praying relief relative to certain judgments obtained against them by the state ; which was read and referred to Messrs. Ridgely, Cresap and Prather.
