NEGATIVE.

So it was resolved in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act concerning public worship, was returned to the senate. The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to enlarge the powers of the levy court of Talbot county for the benefit of the poor of said county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. A bill, entitled, An act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and precincts of Baltimore; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the chancellor and the several county courts of this state to order and decree the sales of real estate of minors; and a bill, entitled, An act to alter such parts of the declaration of rights, the constitution and form of government, as relate to the administration of oaths in certain cases, severally endorsed, passed by the senate January 22d, 1817; which were severally read. A communication from the clerk of Baltimore county court relative to the number of cases now depending in the said court for ce tain years; also a communication from the clerk of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery of Baltimore County, relative to the number of recognizances, presentments and petitions for the two last years; which were severally read and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by M. Kell, Ordered, That the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and precincts of Baltimore, be printed.

On motion by Mr F. M. Hall, Ordered, That the bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of the Planters Bank of Prince-George's county, be made the order of the day for to-morrow.

The bill to make the final discharge of trustees appointed by the chancellor or judges of the county court matter of record, was read the second time, assented, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the following resolution was read. Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Jehu Chandler the sum of \_\_\_\_\_ dollars; which sum will make his salary equal to fourteen hundred dollars per annum while printer to the state.

On motion by Mr. Kell, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore Improving Company. Ordered, That Messrs. Kell, Warner and W. Stewart, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr Kell delivers petitions from Mark L. Descaves, Philip Mercier, David Easterbrook, and William Taylor of the city of Baltimore, praying special acts of insolvency; which were severally read and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a petition from James Jaffray, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a law authorising the alteration of a docket entry in Baltimore county court; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Semmes delivers a petition from Michael Lovejoy, of Prince-George's county, praying for a law authorising the inspector of the Nottingham tobacco ware house to deliver to him a hogshead of second tobacco the note of which was lost or mislaid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Semmes, F. M. Hall and Posey.

Mr. A. D. Mitchell delivers a petition from John Bennett, a revolutionary soldier, praying compensation for his services; which was read and referred to Messrs. A. D. Mitchell, Beard and Thomas.

Mr. Bradford delivers a petition from John Street, of Harford county, praying to be allowed damages relative to a road running through his lands in Harford county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Bradford, Glenn and Sewell.

Mr. Hambleton delivers a petition from Solomon Lowe, of Talbot county, praying to be paid for furnishing certain British officers and seamen with rations, which were captured by the militia in the late war; which was read and referred to the committee of claims.

Mr. T. H. Dorsey delivers a petition from George W. Higgins, of Anne Arundel county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

The speaker laid before the house an affidavit from Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esquire, stating that John Kennedy, who is now in Virginia, and Henry Didier, senr who is sick and unable to attend, are material witnesses for his defence before this house; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr Warner delivers a memorial from a number of the inhabitants and property holders of the western precincts of Baltimore against the passage of the bill annexing the said precincts with the city; which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, A further additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, and after some time spent therein, the further consideration thereof was postponed until to-morrow.

The house adjourns until this evening 7 o'clock.
