POST MERIDIEM, 7 O'CLOCK.

The house met.

The bill to incorporate the Philomathean Society of Upper Marlborough, in Prince-George's county, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill to incorporate the Saint Andrew's Society of the city of Baltimore; the supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; the bill to shut up an old road in Cecil county; the bill to lay out a town to be called Middle-Town, in Prince George's county; the bill to incorporate the Medical Society of Maryland; the bill to widen a part of Bridge street in the city of Baltimore; the bill for laying out and opening a road in Harford county; the bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall in Elkton Cecil county; the bill authorising the levy court of Calvert county to borrow a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; the bill to repeal the act, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county; and the additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge, were severally read the second time and passed.

Mr. Thomas delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to the site of the proposed bridge near Rock Run; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Semmes the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That all proceedings against Notley Maddox and his securities, on a judgment obtained against them on account of a balance due to the state by the said Notley Maddox, as former sheriff of Prince-George's county, be and they are hereby suspended until the first day of January eighteen hundred and eighteen, and also that the said Notley Maddox, and his securities, be and they are hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum of the fifteen per cent interest chargeable upon the principal of the balance due the state, on condition only that the said Notley Maddox, and his securities, shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the western shore on or before the first day of January eighteen hundred and eighteen, the principal of the balance due the state, with interest on the same at the rate of six per cent per annum, together with all costs on said judgments; provided that the judgments shall be in full force and continue, notwithstanding the suspension directed by this resolution; and that if the said Notley Maddox, and his securities, shall fail in said payment they shall forfeit the benefit of this resolution and shall be liable to be proceeded against immediately for the whole of the said debt and cost, and the fifteen per cent interest now payable thereon.

On motion by Mr. Semmes, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Prince-George's county to levy on said county money for the support of sundry persons as out pensioners. Ordered, That Messrs. Semmes, F.M. Hall and Posey, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Kell delivers a petition from sundry creditors of William Hollins, counter to his petition praying for a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 25, 1817.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christianna bridge; the bill to repeal the act, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county; the bill authorising the levy court of Calvert county to borrow a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; the bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall in Elkton Cecil county; the bill for laying out and opening a road in Harford county; the bill to incorporate the Medical Society of Maryland; the bill to widen a part of Bridge street in the city of Baltimore; the bill to lay out a town to be called Middle-Town in Prince-George's county; the bill to shut up an old road in Cecil county; the supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; the bill to incorporate the Saint Andrews Society of the city of Baltimore; the bill to incorporate the Philomathean Society of Upper Marlborough in Prince-George's county, and the bill supplementary to an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Princess Anne in Somerset county; the resolutions relative to the fisheries of the Potomac; for the removal of Zebulon Hollingsworth an associate judge of the sixth judicial district of Maryland; and in favour of John Bennett, were sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Planters Bank of Prince-George's county. On motion by Mr. Semmes, the question was put, That the following section be added to the bill: And be it enacted, that the bank shall pay to the treasurer of the western shore the sum of twenty cents upon the amount of every hundred dollars subscribed and actually paid in, for each and every year during the continuance of the charter, which sum shall be and the same is hereby pledged by the state, as a fund for the purpose of sup-
