

said bank shall pay to the treasurer of the western shore the sum of twenty cents upon the amount of every hundred dollars subscribed and actually paid in for each and every year during the continuance of its charter, which sum shall be and the same is hereby pledged by the state as a fund for the purpose of supporting county schools, to be equally divided among the several counties of this state, and paid over in equal portions to such persons in each county as the legislature may hereafter appoint."

On motion by Mr. Causin the following section was added to the bill: "And be it enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force until the first day of November eighteen hundred and thirty-five, and until the end of the next session of assembly that shall happen thereafter."

The bill having been read throughout and amended, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

So it was resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Blakistone, the question was put, That leave be given to bring in a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to vest certain powers in the governor and council? Resolved in the affirmative. Ordered, That Messrs. Blakistone, Causin and Posey, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Banning, Ordered, That the committee of claims allow on the journal of accounts to the rev. John J. Jacobs one hundred dollars, for his services as chaplain to the house of delegates, and the sum of one hundred dollars to the rev. Henry L. Davis for his services as chaplain to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Banning the following resolution was read and assented to.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Louis Gassaway chief clerk of the house of delegates the sum of one hundred dollars, to Richard Harwood chief clerk to the senate one hundred dollars, to John Stevens, jun. assistant clerk to the house of delegates one hundred dollars, and to John N. Watkins assistant clerk to the senate the sum of fifty dollars, as an additional compensation for extraordinary services during the present session.

On motion by Mr. Banning the following resolution was read and assented to.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Henry Gassaway, or to his order, the sum of fifty dollars, for his services as messenger to the court of chancery.

On motion by Mr. Banning the following order was read.

Ordered, That the committee of claims allow on the journal of accounts to Frederick Grammer, the sum of fifty dollars, for his services in the house of delegates, and place the same on the journal of accounts.

On motion by Mr. Haynie, the question was put, that the word "fifty" in the said order be stricken out for the purpose of inserting "one hundred?" Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the house adopt the said order? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Banning the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Caleb Stewart door-keeper to the house of delegates the sum of sixty dollars, and to Gotlieb J. Grammer messenger to the senate, the sum of fifty dollars, for taking care of the furniture of their respective houses.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the said resolution. On motion by Mr. Claude, the question was put to strike out "sixty dollars" to Caleb Stewart, and to insert in lieu thereof "to Cornelius Mills sergeant at arms thirty dollars, and to Caleb Stewart thirty dollars?" Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, the question was put, That "sixty dollars" to Gotlieb J. Grammer be stricken out, and the following inserted in lieu thereof; "to Gotlieb J. Grammer messenger to the senate the sum of thirty dollars, and to Henry Coulter door-keeper to the senate the sum of thirty dollars?" Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the resolution as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

The house according to the order of the day proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore city. On motion by Mr. Kell, the words "to a public road passing from the Philadelphia post road by the dwellings of Amos Loney, Thomas Worthington, and others," were inserted after the word "point" in the 11th line of the 1st section of the bill.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the words "drawn from the termination of the said seven hundred perches to the Patapsco river so as to touch and include the Lazaretto," were stricken out of the first section and the words "binding on the east side of said road to the Philadelphia post road, and from the Philadelphia post road by a straight line to the north-east corner of the Lazaretto lot, including said lot; and then with the lines of said lot to the Patapsco river," inserted in lieu thereof.

On motion by Mr. Kell, the words "thence up and with Gwynn's run to the Baltimore and Frederick-Town turnpike road," were stricken out of the 1st section of the bill.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the words "one hundred yards" were stricken out of the third section and the words "fifty perches" inserted in lieu thereof.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the word "land" in the 11th line of the 6th section of the bill was stricken out and the words "real or personal property" inserted in lieu thereof.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the word "thereof" in the 1st line of the same section was stricken out and the words "of land" inserted in lieu thereof.
