

The bill from the senate entitled, A supplement to the act for opening and extending North-street in the city of Baltimore, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Tyson delivers a petition from Hannah A. Hayes, guardian of the minor children of Stephen Hayes, praying for a law authorising her to sell and convey the interest of said minors in certain real and personal estate, which was read and referred to Messrs. Tyson, Stevens and Beard.

On motion by Mr. Saulsbury, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise James Keene, late sheriff of Caroline county, to complete his collections. Ordered, That Messrs. Saulsbury, Whitely and Stevens, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The report on the petition of John Robbins, a revolutionary soldier, was read the second time, concurred in, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Woodyear delivers a petition from the members of the Washington Hose Company, praying for a lottery for the benefit of said company; also praying for an act of incorporation; which was read and referred to Messrs. Woodyear, Keil and Sewell.

Mr. Woodyear delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named; which was read.

Mr. Kell delivers a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the acts relating to the equity jurisdiction of the county courts; which was read.

Mr. Price delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying for the building of a bridge over Meredith's Ford; which was read and referred to Messrs. Price, Johnson and Showers.

Mr. Blakistone delivers a petition from Edward Maddox and Samuel Maddox, of Saint Mary's county, praying for a law vesting in them, and the children of their brother John Maddox, a fee simple estate in certain lands devised to them by their father Samuel Maddox; which was read and referred to Messrs. Blakistone, Tingle and Jones.

Mr. Harrison delivers a petition from Roderick Earickson, of Queen Anne's county, praying for a law authorising the division of certain lands of Thomas Winchester deceased; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Wilson, Lecompte, Causin and Bradford.

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth R. Snyder of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the senate.

Mr. Forrest delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of the town of Rockville in Montgomery county, praying for a law to prevent geese and swine from running at large in the said town; which was read and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Gaither and Linthicum.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a petition from John Gassaway, of the city of Annapolis, praying compensation for services rendered by him as adjutant-general during the late war; which was read and referred to Messrs. Lecompte, Claude and Martin.

Mr. Kell delivers a bill, entitled, An act relating to Dark-lane in the city of Baltimore; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, Ordered, That so much of the executive communication of the 1st instant as relates to the application of the American Antiquarian Society of Massachusetts for a copy of the acts and votes and proceedings of the legislature of this state, be referred to Messrs. Lecompte, Stevens, Knight, Somerville and Blakistone, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Griffith delivers a petition from Michael Fitchitt, of Dorchester county, counter to the petition of sundry inhabitants of said county for a law to alter, change and widen, the road leading from Vienna to Henry's Cross Roads; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

Mr. Neale delivers a petition from Edward Brown, late sheriff of Kent county, praying further time to complete his collection; which was read and referred to Messrs. Neale, Eccleston and Hynson.

Mr. Woodyear delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the establishment of an additional warehouse in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco; which was read.

The resolution in favor of Nolley Maddox, and his securities, was read the second time and assented to.

Mr. Washington delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make certain turnpike roads through the counties of Montgomery, Frederick and Washington, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Davis delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of the shad fisheries in the river Susquehanna; which was read.

Mr. Washington delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of John Brown, late of Montgomery county, deceased, which was read.

On motion by Mr. Woodyear, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower Thomas W. Griffith, late collector of the taxes of Baltimore county, to complete his collections. Ordered, That Messrs. Woodyear, Yates and Kell, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to repeal an act, entitled, An act to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the towns of Upper Marlborough and Nottingham in Prince George's county, so far as it relates to the town of Upper Marlborough, endorsed, will pass; Ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the benefit of William Cowan, of Cecil county, endorsed, will pass with the proposed amendment; which amendment was read. The bill for the relief of Jesse Hughes, of Somerset county, endorsed, will not pass. A bill, entitled, An act to repeal the several acts of assembly for the destruction of crows in Somerset and Calvert counties. A bill, entitled, An act to authorise Daniel C. Holliday to import and bring into this state the negro slave therein mentioned; and a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Eliza P. Custis of Baltimore, severally endorsed, passed by the senate January 3, 1818; which were read. Also a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for completing an episcopal church in Baltimore county; which was read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

Mr. Blakistone delivers a bill, entitled, An act to confirm and make valid the last will and testament of Samuel Maddox, late of Saint Mary's county, deceased; which was read.

Mr. Kell delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Elizabeth Johnson of the city of Baltimore. Also a bill, entitled, An act to enable Robert Gorsuch to complete his collection in Baltimore county; which were severally read.

Mr. Tyson delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise Hannah A. Hayes, guardian of the minor chil-
