On motion by Mr. Lecompte, the following preamble and resolutions were read:

Whereas, it is essentially necessary that the decisions which have taken place, and which may hereafter take place, in the superior courts of this state, should be generally known throughout the state, and that encouragement should be given to reporters of such decisions, therefore, Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he hereby is directed, to purchase from the reporters of the decisions which have taken place, and which may hereafter take place, in the superior courts of this state, copies of those which have already been published, and the like number of copies of those which may hereafter be published, and to pay the amount thereof out of any money in the treasury.

Resolved, That the governor and council cause the said books as they shall be purchased to be forwarded and distributed as follows: To the court of appeals for each shore two copies; to the court of chancery one copy; to each county court two copies; to Baltimore city and county courts two copies; to each orphans court one copy; to the general assembly four copies; and to the executive one copy; to the land office for the western shore one copy; and to the land office for the eastern shore one copy.
