So it was determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Wilson, the words "for the exclusive use of the bay craft of this state," were stricken out of the said amendment. On motion by Mr. Pearce, the question was put, To amend the said amendment by adding the following words: "which said one hundred and fifty feet, to be designated and laid off at or near the centre of that part of the said street fronting on the basin, and which shall be kept in constant repair?" Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the amendment as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

FRIDAY, January 23, 1818.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, was read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill authorising and empowering the levy court of Saint Mary's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Elizabeth West of said county; the supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, and the bill to alter such parts of the declaration of rights, the constitution and form of government, as relate to the administration of oaths in certain cases, severally endorsed, will pass. Ordered to be engrossed. The bill to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Bank of Dorchester, and the bill to provide for the erection of a new gaol in Hager's Town, Washington county, severally endorsed, will pass with the proposed amendments; which amendments were read, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also a bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of the sitting of the several county courts in the fourth judicial district, endorsed, passed by the senate January 22, 1818; which was read, and on motion by Mr. Lecompte, the said bill was referred to a committee consisting of Messrs. Lecompte, Martin, Jenifer, Carroll, Murray, Olbrook and Tingle. Also a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the conveyance and return of process sued from the courts of one county to the officers of another, endorsed, passed by the senate January 1, 1818; which was read, and on motion by Mr. Lecompte, the said bill was referred to a committee consisting of Messrs. Lecompte, Causin and Harrison.

Mr. Browner delivers a bill, entitled, An act to make a public road in Charles county; which was read.

Mr. Woodyear delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the improvement and extension of Franklin-street from Union-street to Pearl-street; which was read.

Mr. R. Dorsey delivers a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the erection of a bridge over Patapsco Falls Ellicott's old upper mills; which was read.

Mr. Price delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Hutton, of Baltimore county; which was read.

Mr. Carroll delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the preservation of deer in Somerset county; which was read.

Mr. R. Dorsey delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Anne Arundel, Montgomery, and Frederick counties; which was read.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the breadth of a certain road in Kent county, was read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Bradford, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower and authorise the several county courts of this state to direct the opening, straightening or shutting up, of public roads: Ordered, That Messrs. Bradford, Kell and Neale, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
