Mr. Forrest delivers a petition from from Eleanor Kennedy, of the district of Columbia, praying for a law relinquishing to her and the heirs of George Kennedy, the right of the state to lot number eleven in the town of Boonsborough, Washington county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Yates and Sweitzer.

Mr. Tidball delivers a petition from John Hoyer, of Allegany county, praying that the register of the land office may be directed to issue him a warrant for a certain portion of land in Allegany county, which was heretofore paid for by his father Paul Hoyer; which was read and referred to Messrs. Tidball, Stephen and Cresap.

The house resumed the further consideration of the bill to provide for the opening and extension of Pratt-street in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Tingle moved to amend the bill by inserting at the end of the 6th section the following: "And be it enacted, That the said street shall not be opened or extended through the property of any individual injured hereby, until the damages by him, her or them sustained and assessed, as before provided, shall be deposited in some bank in the city of Baltimore, to the credit of the party entitled to receive the same."

On motion by Mr. Eccleston, the question was put, to amend the said amendment by striking out the words "deposited in some bank in the city of Baltimore to the credit of the party entitled to receive the same," for the purpose of inserting the words "paid or tendered to be paid to him her or them." Determined in the negative.
