On motion by Mr. Wilson, the question was put, That the following be inserted after the 6th section, to wit: "And be it enacted, That if any person whose property may be assessed under this law to pay a portion of the damages and expenses incurred by the opening and extension of said street, shall be dissatisfied with the said assessment, it shall be the duty of the commissioners named in this act to ascertain the full value of said property, and the possessor shall have the privilege of offering in writing the same at the said valuation to the mayor and city council of Baltimore, whose duty it shall be to take said property at the valuation aforesaid, and pay the owner therefor, before the city commissioners and port wardens aforesaid shall proceed to open and extend said street?" Mr. Lecompte moved to insert after the word "not" in the fifth line of the eleventh page the following words: "and in case any person shall apply for the payment of their portion of the assessed damages, and the same shall be refused, or neglected to be paid within five days, then all the power and authority invested in the said city commissioners and port wardens, to open and extend said street, shall be abrogated and annulled, and all further proceedings under the said act shall cease."

On motion by Mr. Kell, the following words were added to the said amendment: "until such payment be made or tendered, and if the said sum should be claimed by any other person, such claim shall not impede the execution of this act in opening said street."

The question was then put, That the house adopt the amendment as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, the question was put, To strike out from the word "not" in the fifth line of the eleventh page to the end of the tenth section? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill having been read throughout and amended, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
