On motion by Mr. Wilson, Ordered, That the bill from the senate entitled, An act to prevent the unlawful exportation of negroes and mulattoes, and to alter and amend the laws concerning runaways, be referred to a committee consisting of Messrs. Wilson, Kell, Blakistone, Causin and Eccleston.

On motion by Mr. Wilson, the question was put, That the order of the day for the second reading of the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Frederick County Bank, be postponed? Determined in the negative.

The bill authorising Jane Blake, of Kent county, an alien, to hold real property, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth League of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed, and returned to the senate.

The bill to provide for building bridges over Patuxent river, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The house according to the order of the day proceeded to the second reading of the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Frederick County Bank.

On motion by Mr. Washington, the question was put, That the first section of the bill be stricken out, viz. "Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a bank to be called and known by the name of The Frederick County Bank, shall be established in Frederick town, the capital stock of which shall consist of five hundred thousand dollars, money of the United States, to be divided into shares of fifty dollars each." FRIDAY, January 30, 1818.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed November session eighteen hundred and five; and the bill to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Frederick county bank, were sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to regulate the charges on tobacco inspected in Prince-George's county, and the supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments severally endorsed, will pass. Ordered to be engrossed Also a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to alter and change such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Anne-Arundel county into election districts, and to change the place of holding elections in the second election district of said county, endorsed, passed by the senate January 29, 1818; which was read.
