That it appears to your committee the said treasurer hath paid away from the first of Noyember 1818, to the first of December 1819, the sum of 185,190 dollars and 78 1-2 cents. For all which payments, have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 133,717 dollars and 83 cents exchanged six per cent stock of the United States, 335,104 dollars and 74 cents, funded three per cent stock of the United States; 4263 dollars and 07 cents of the emissions of bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March 1780; and the sum of 22,857 dollars and 19 cents cash; which sum of cash is appropriated in the manner following to wit:

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, the following message was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, December 13, 1819.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

We propose with the concurrence of your honourable body to proceed immediately to the election of two senators to represent this state in the senate of the United States. William Pinkney Esq. Colonel Edward Lloyd, Robert H. Goldsborough, Esq and Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Esq. are put in nomination by this house. Messrs. Maulsby and Dashiell are appointed on the part of this house to join such gentlemen as may be named by you to count the ballots and report the result.

Resolved, That one of the persons to be chosen shall be a resident of the western shore, and the other a resident of the eastern shore of the state of Maryland, and that the persons having a majority of all the attending members of both houses of the general assembly be declared duly elected to represent this state in the senate of the United States, and that commissions issue to the said senators, appointed as aforesaid, signed by the governor for the time being, or in his absence by the presiding member of the council, for the person chosen for the western shore in the following words, to wit: The State of Maryland, to
