

Mr. Montgomery delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the Washington Monument; which was read the first and second time by especial order, and on motion by Mr. Jenifer, the question was put, That the same lie on the table? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

So it was resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

Mr. Millard presents a petition from Charles and Sarah Neale, of Saint Mary's county, praying for support for their daughter Mary; which was read and referred to Messrs. Millard, Blakistone and Plater. The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Nelly Seegar, and the bill to empower the county court of Queen Anne's county to divide the real estate therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

And a bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act of assembly entitled, An act authorising the connecting of Water street with King George street at Jones's Falls in the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass," which was read.

The bill for the benefit of Mary Ann W. Haymond of Montgomery county, was read the second time and passed.

The house resumed the consideration of the report of the committee of elections; and on motion by Mr. Lecompte, That the second resolution be stricken out from the word "Resolved" for the purpose of inserting the following: "As there is no allegation in the foregoing report, of fraud, or wilful misconduct on the part of the judges of the election in Calvert county, and as they are by law constituted the judges of the qualifications of voters, this house is of the opinion, that no scrutiny of the legality of votes taken and received in said county ought to be made."

A division of the question was called for by Mr. Montgomery, and the question put on striking out? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, That the second resolution be stricken out for the purpose of inserting the following to wit:

Ordered, That this house will, in the progress of the scrutiny into the contested election of Calvert county, adopt the following rules;

- 1st. The petitioners shall file with the clerk of this house forthwith, a specification of the respective votes by them challenged as illegal, and for what cause objected to.
2d. The petitioners shall file with the clerk of this house, an enumeration of the voters who offered to poll, and who were rejected, and in what election district they offered to poll.
3d. The petitioners shall file with the clerk of this house, an examination of the witnesses by whom they expect to prove each of their specific allegations.
4th. The returned members shall adopt the like course of proceedings if they require scrutiny of the petitioners votes, or the benefit of rejected votes.
5th. For the witnesses thus designated subpoenas shall issue returnable on a day to be appointed by the house.
6th. This house, upon the final hearing of this subject, will receive evidence of no other objection to the polls than those thus enumerated.
7th. Subpoenas shall be issued at any time at the instance of the memorialists, or the sitting members to impeach or support the credit of witnesses produced.
