

Resolved, That the resolution adopted at the last general assembly, calling for information from the several banks in this state, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

The bill for the relief of Lambert W. Ford, James Christie and Edmond Brown, of Cecil county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the several members of the general assembly and the officers thereof, the amount of the several sums due to them, and for which they shall obtain certificates from the chairman of the committee of claims.

Mr. Forrest presents a petition from Richard B. Dorsey, and others, of Montgomery county, praying for a sale of part of the real estate of their deceased father; which was read and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Maulsby and Gaither.

Mr. Blakistone presents a petition from Ann Branson, of St. Mary's county, praying for support; which was read and referred to the committee on the petition of Ally Buckler.

The bill for the relief of Richard Dove, and Eleanor his wife; the bill to allow Arnold T. Winsor, sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, further time to complete his collection, and the bill supplementary to the act, entitled, An act for the support of Evan Price, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to repeal an act to prevent swine from going at large in the town of Salisbury, and the bill to authorise the levy court of Charles county to dispose of the property therein mentioned, severally endorsed "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill for the relief of Mary Dean, of St. Mary's county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill annulling the marriage of Mary Murray and Charles Murray, of Cecil county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill annulling the marriage of John Frenner and Mary his wife, of Washington county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to repeal an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and eighteen, entitled, An act to regulate the manner of granting licenses to retailers of spirituous liquors, and to prevent persons from dealing with free negroes after sunset in Kent county, endorsed "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill annulling the marriage of Thomas F. Ward and Ann Ward, of St. Mary's county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Boyie presents a petition from the visitors and governors of Saint John's College, praying for a repeal of the act passed in 1805, for withdrawing the funds from said College; which was read and referred to Messrs. Boyie, Harrison and Duvall.

Mr. W. R. Stuart delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising Richard Moffitt, late sheriff of Queen Anne's county, to complete his collection; which was read.

The bill to repeal the fourth section of an act, passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, entitled, An additional supplement to the act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed November session eighteen hundred and five, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Dorsey delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to facilitate the recovery of debts due from the several banks in this state, and to compel the said banks to pay specie for their notes or forfeit their charters; which was read.

Mr. Duvall delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; which was read.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from the Union Insurance Company, praying for an extension of their charter; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and Duvall.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of Teakle Taylor, of Worcester county, endorsed "will pass". Ordered to be engrossed. And the bill for the appointment of a trustee for Eliza Matthews, the wife of Doctor William P. Matthews, of Baltimore county, and her children, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Jackson presents a petition from William Merrick, of Dorchester county, a revolutionary soldier, which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from Mary Kline; of the city of Baltimore, praying a divorce, which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and A. H. Price.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to punish the offence of kidnapping white children. Ordered, That Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and Harrison, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, That the house adjourn until Monday morning 9 o'clock? Determined in the negative.
